ittle Big Econ State Forest offers birders a unique opportunity to observe numerous species of birds from two distinct habitats. The Demetree Tract, located south of CR 426 on Snowhill Road, provides a parking area surrounded by a longleaf pine restoration project. This area is frequented by meadowlarks, bluebirds, sparrows and raptors. Follow the trail southwest to the Econolockhatchee River for excellent birding diversity of resident and migratory songbirds such as summer tanagers, blue grosbeaks, vireos and black-throated blue warblers.

The Kilbee Tract is located on SR 46, 4.3 miles east of CR 426. After parking and hiking one mile, you'll arrive at the St. John's River which offers an expansive view of waders, shorebirds and ducks, especially in fall and winter.
