EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2023, Florida agricultural and related products exports totaled \$6,596,634,249, a **2.3% increase** over 2022. The \$6.6 billion in Florida exports:

- Supported 83,117 jobs.
- Produced \$243.4 million in additional business tax revenue.
- Generated \$10.0 billion in total economic impact.

Florida exported agricultural products to 161 countries and territories in 2023, with 96 receiving more than \$1 million in Florida agricultural exports.

The top 10 commodities accounted for 58.1% of all Florida agricultural and related products exports.

Florida's top exported fresh fruits include strawberries (\$62.8 mil), watermelons (\$53.7 mil), blueberries (\$36.9 mil), melons (\$20.1 mil), oranges (\$11.2 mil), and grapefruits (\$9.7 mil).

Florida's top exported fresh vegetables include tomatoes (\$53.9 mil), peppers (\$42.7 mil), brassicas (\$32.7 mil), snap beans (\$27.6 mil), and lettuce (\$23.6 mil).

The top 10 destinations accounted for 56.4% of all Florida agricultural and related products exports.

United States Agricultural & Related Products Exports

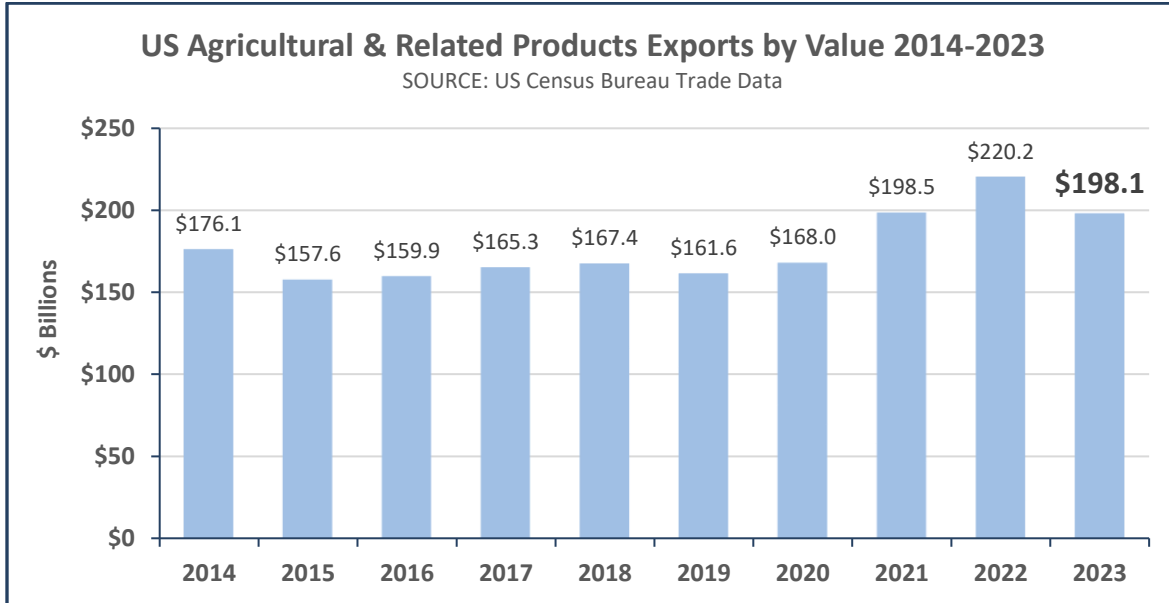


Figure 1 – 2014-2023 US Agricultural & Related Products Exports by Value

The United States Agricultural and Related Products include soybeans, corn, beef, dairy, tree nuts, pork, cotton, and other agricultural related products. The United States Agricultural and Related Products exports have decreased by 10.1% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 12.5% over 2014 (Figure 1).

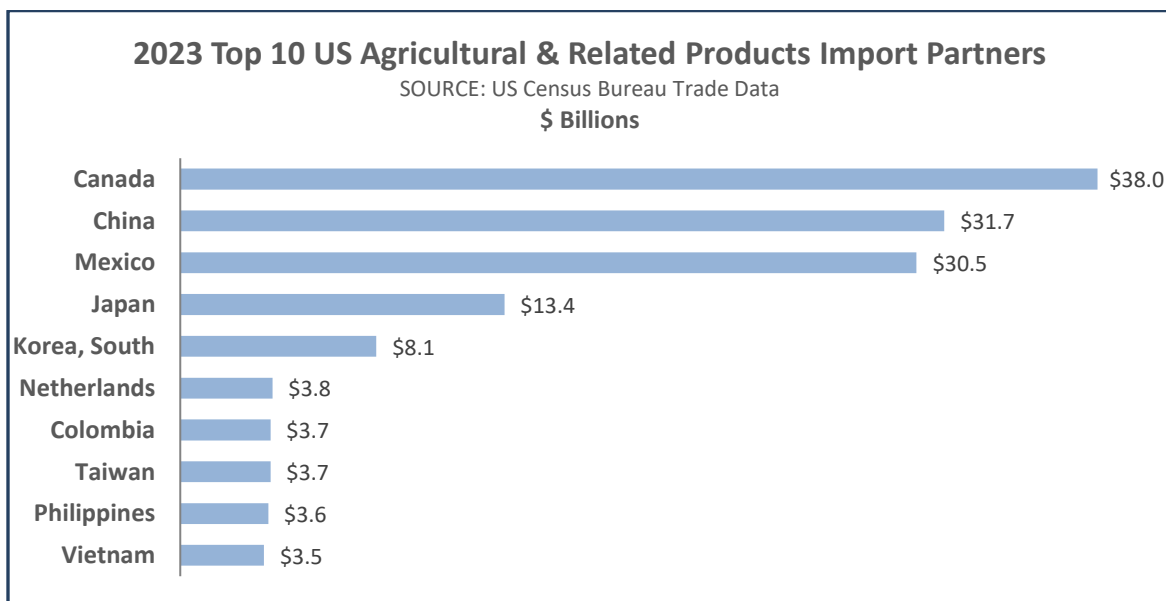


Figure 2 – 2023 Top 10 US Agricultural & Related Products Export Partners

Canada is the largest US Agricultural and Related Products import partner with 19.2% of all Agricultural and Related Products exported from the United States (Figure 2). Canada primarily imports fresh fruits, bakery goods, fresh vegetables, and forest products from the United States. Canada’s import of US Agricultural and Related Products has decreased by 1.9% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 23.9% over 2014.

Florida Agricultural & Related Products Exports

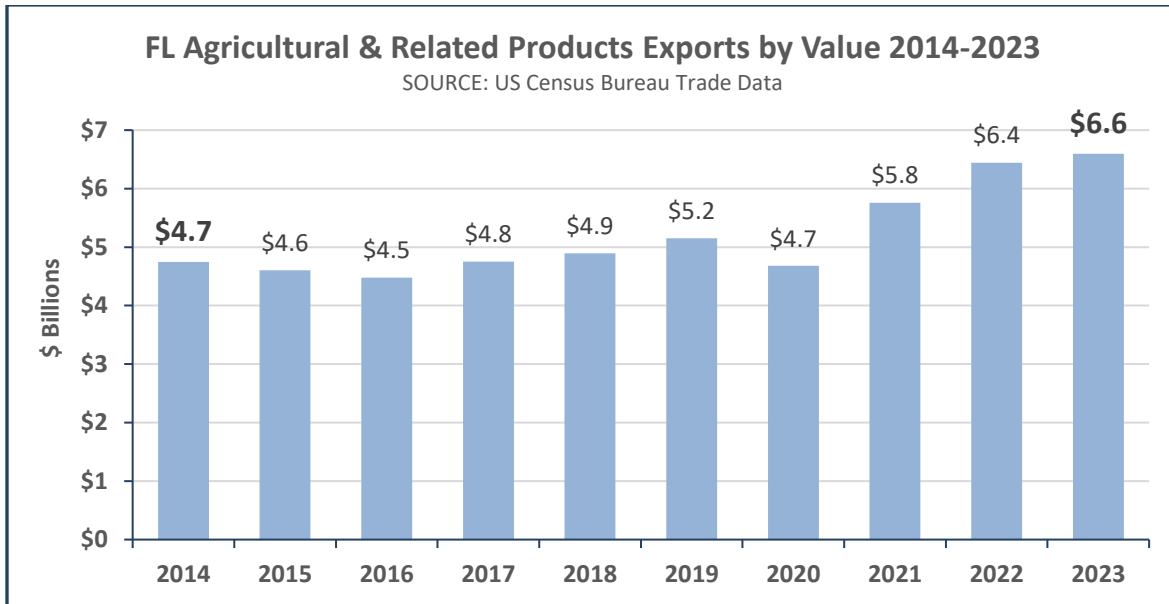


Figure 3 – 2014-2023 FL Agricultural & Related Products Exports by Value

The annual exports of Florida Agricultural and Related Products increased by 2.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 39.0% over 2014 (Figure 3).

Florida’s Leading Export Commodities

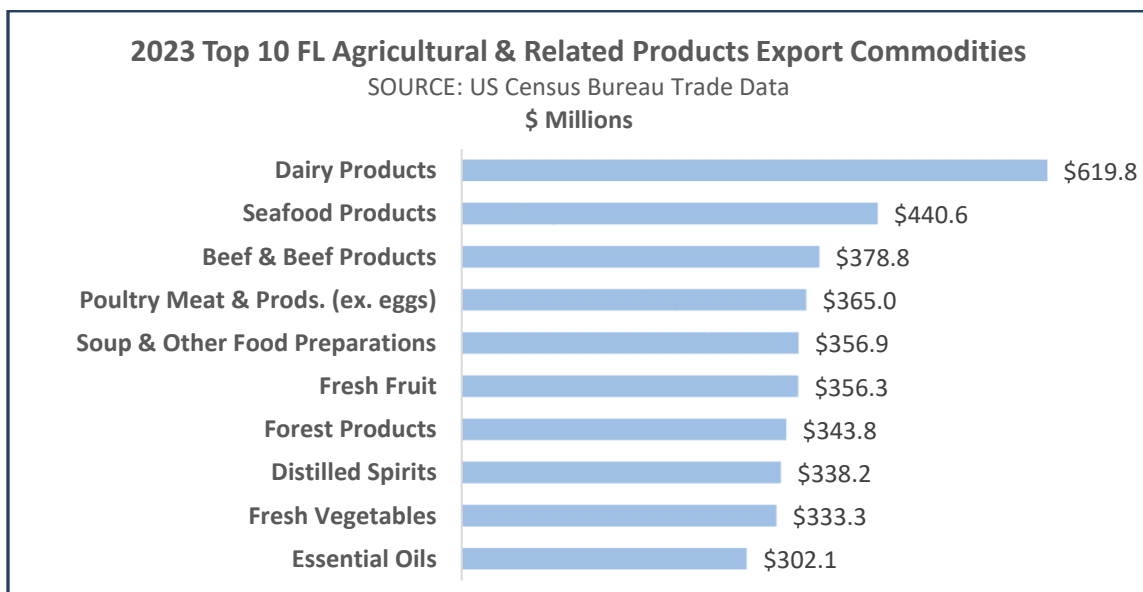


Figure 4 – 2023 Top 10 FL Agricultural & Related Products Export Commodities

Florida Agricultural and Related Products top 10 commodities include dairy, seafood products, beef and beef products, poultry meat and products, soup and other food preparations, fresh fruit, forest products, distilled spirits, fresh vegetables, and essential oils (Figure 4). Altogether, the top 10 Florida commodities have decreased by 1.7% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 40.1% over 2014.

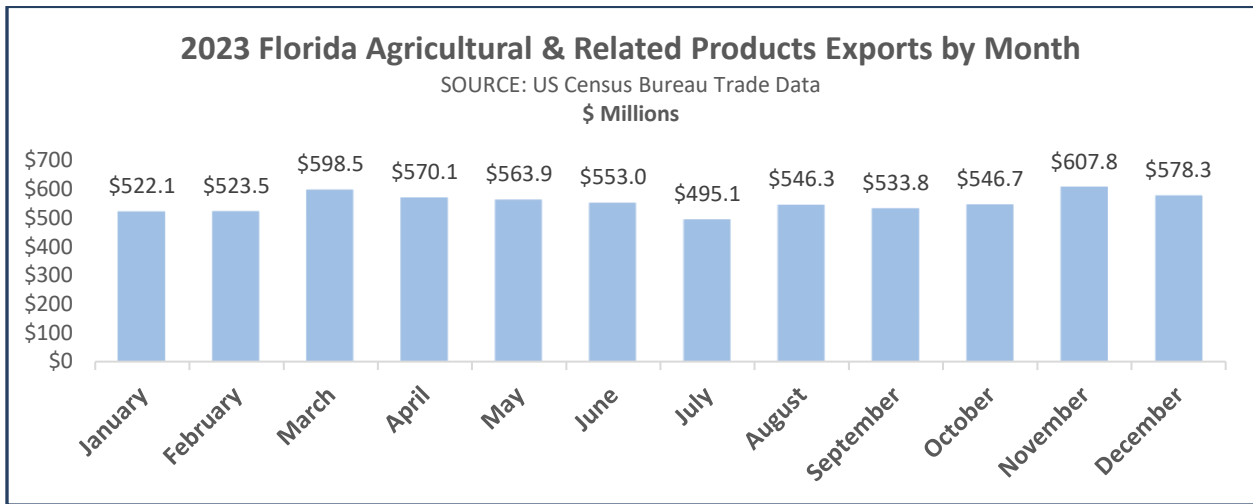


Figure 5 – 2023 Florida Agricultural & Related Products Exports by Month

Florida ships commodities year-round with spring and fall being the busiest seasons in 2023 (Figure 5). Trade ebbs during the winter before picking up in March. In 2023, November had the most activity at \$607.8 million, and July had the least at \$495.1 million.

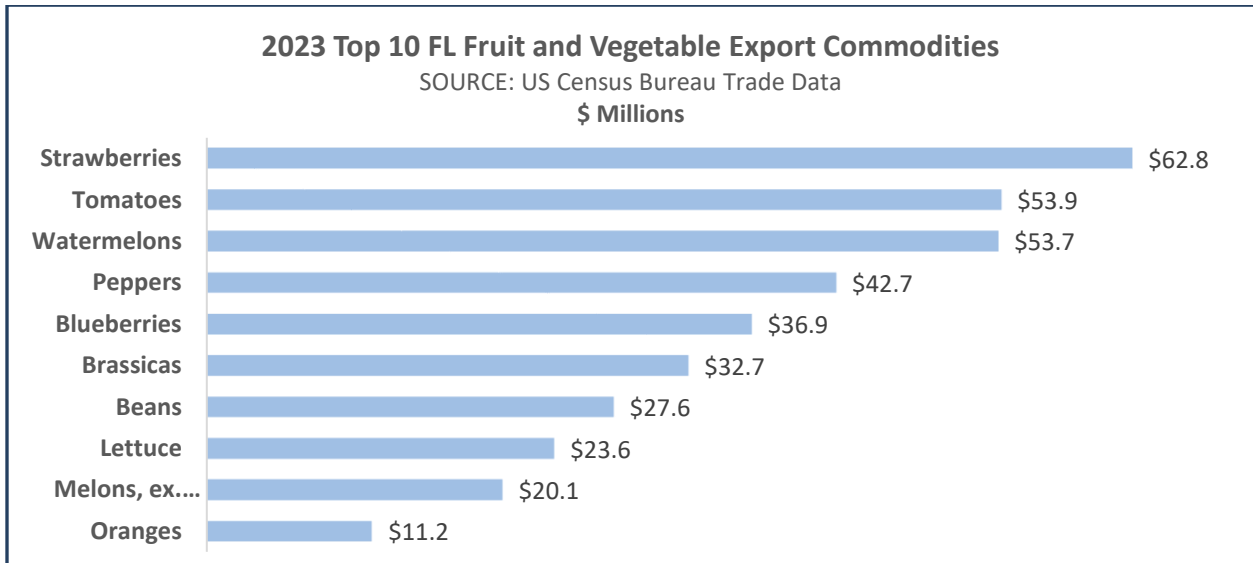


Figure 6 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fruit & Vegetable Export Commodities

Altogether, the top 10 Florida Fruit and Vegetable Export Commodities have increased by 3.6% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 9.2% over 2014 (Figure 6). Brassicas represent cabbages, cauliflower, and broccoli.

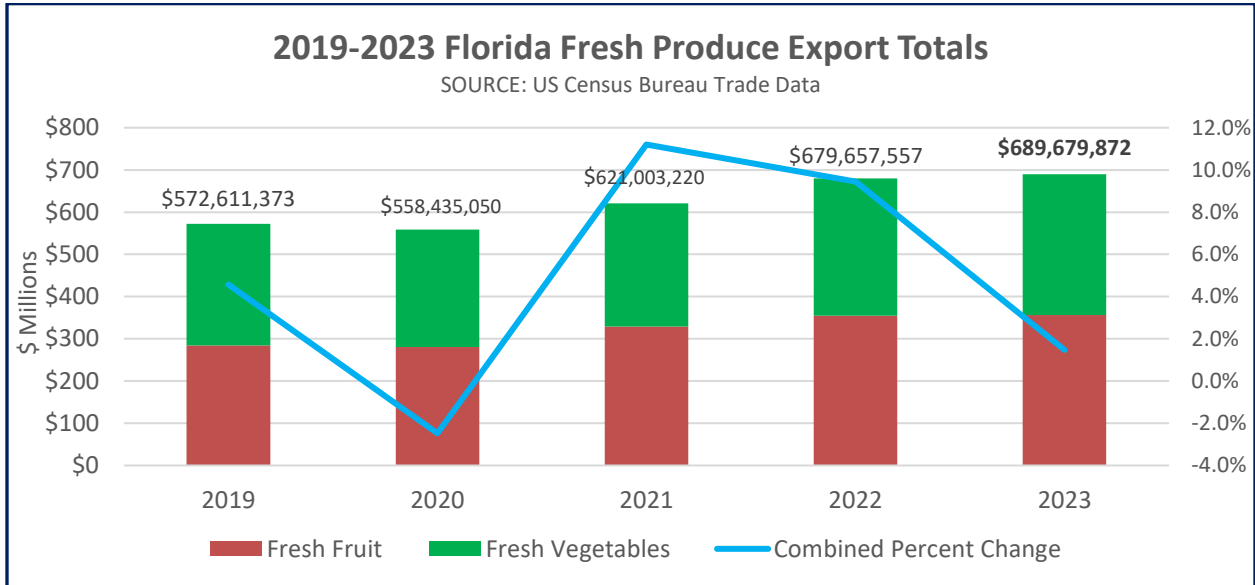


Figure 7 – 2019-2023 Florida Fresh Produce Export Totals

Altogether, Florida Fresh Produce exports have increased by 1.5% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 20.4% over 2019 (Figure 7).

Florida’s Leading Export Partners

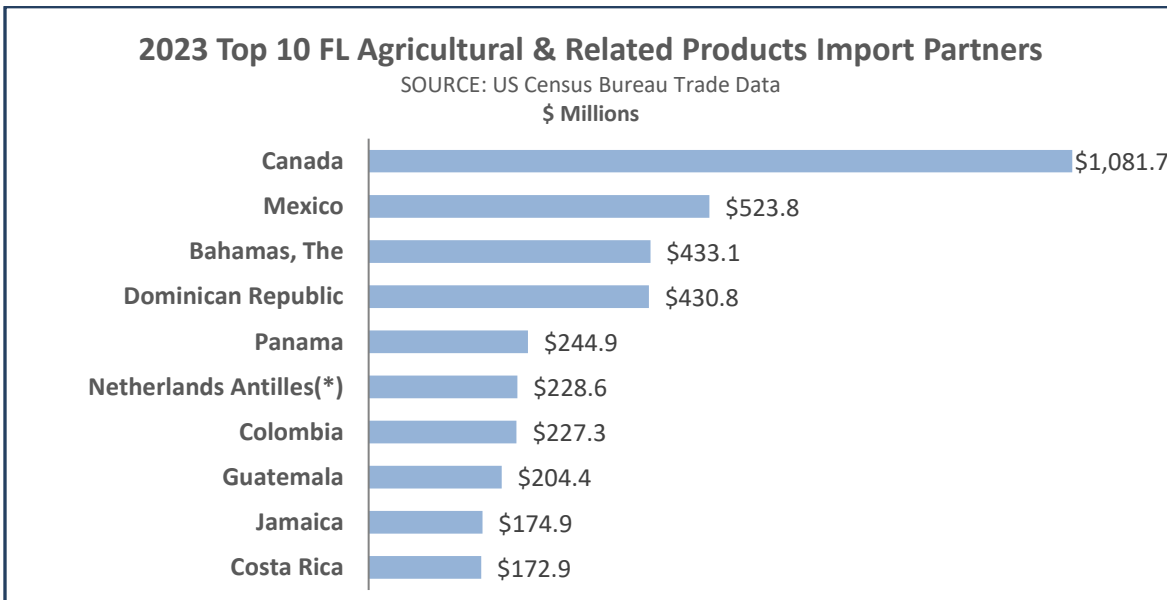


Figure 8 – 2023 Top 10 FL Agricultural & Related Products Export Partners

Canada tops Florida’s list of agricultural export partners for the 24th consecutive year (Figure 8). Exports to Canada represented 16.4% of all Florida agricultural exports in 2023. Mexico remained second, just ahead of the Bahamas and the Dominican Republic. The top 10 leading destinations accounted for 56.4% in 2023.

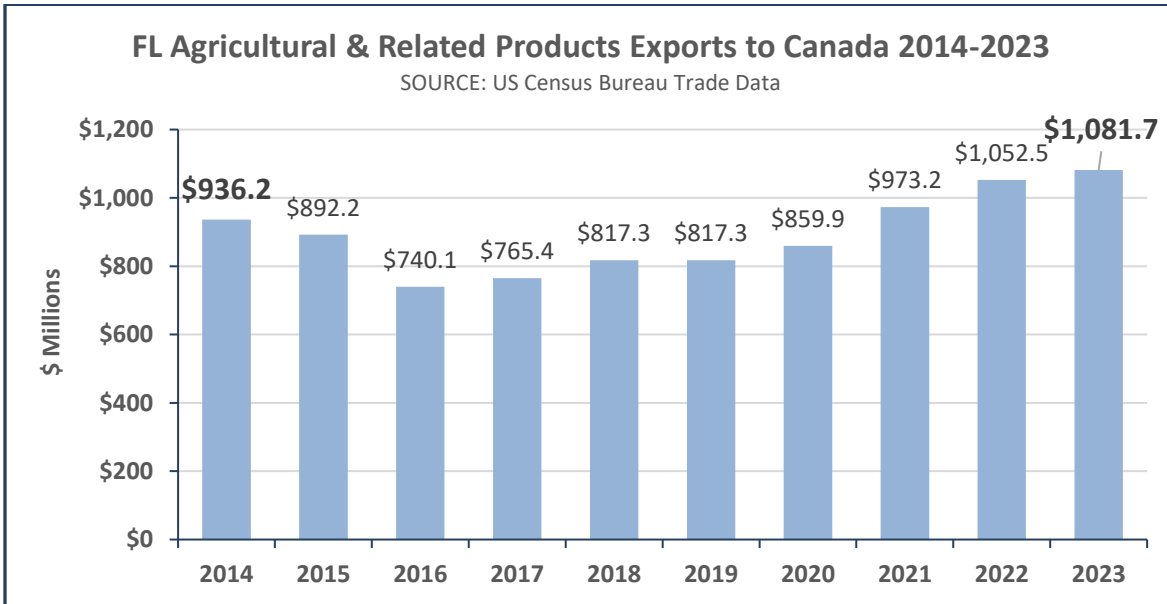


Figure 9 – 2014-2023 FL Agricultural & Related Products Exports to Canada

Florida Agricultural and Related Products exports to Canada have increased by 2.8% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 15.5% over 2014 (Figure 9).

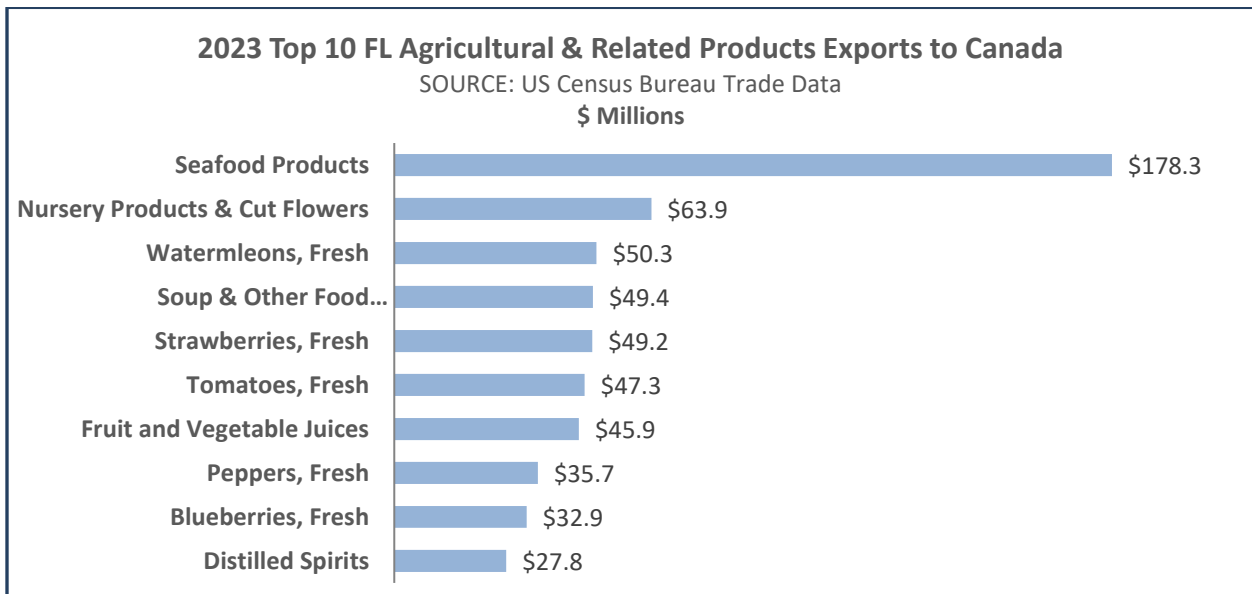


Figure 10 – 2023 Top 10 FL Agricultural & Related Products Exports to Canada

Canada is the leading destination for Florida’s seafood products, nursery products and cut flowers, fresh fruits, and fresh vegetables, including strawberries, tomatoes, watermelons, peppers, and blueberries (Figure 10).

Top 10 Florida Commodity Exports

1) Dairy Products

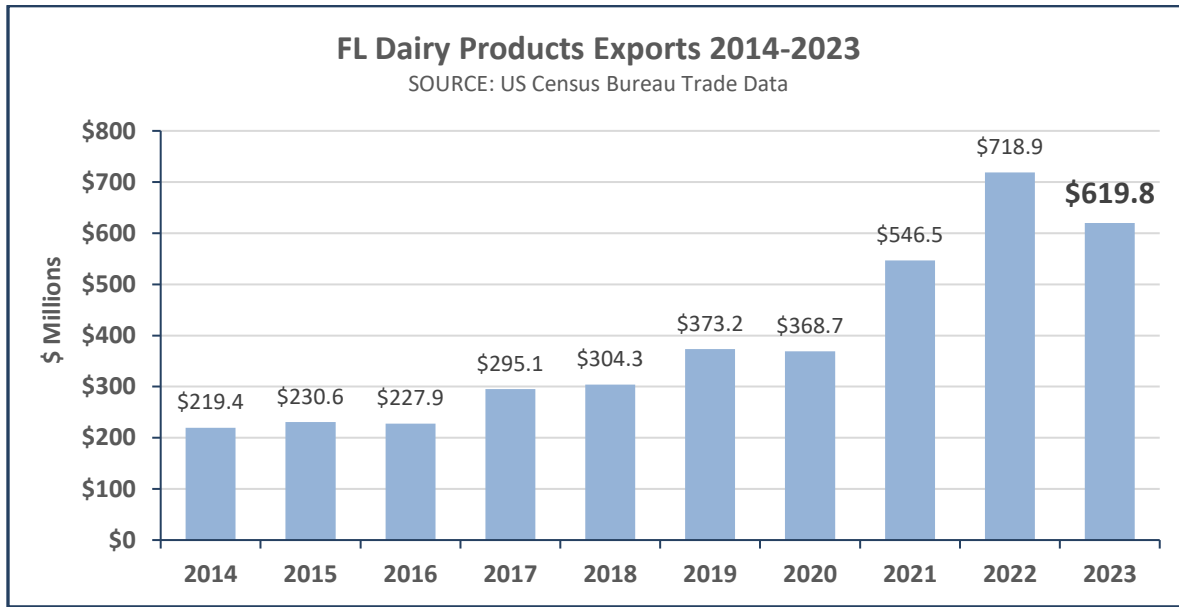


Figure 11 – 2014-2023 FL Dairy Products Exports

Florida Dairy Products include milk, cream, butter, powdered milk, and other milk related products. Florida Dairy Products exports have decreased by 13.8% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 182.5% over 2014 (Figure 11).

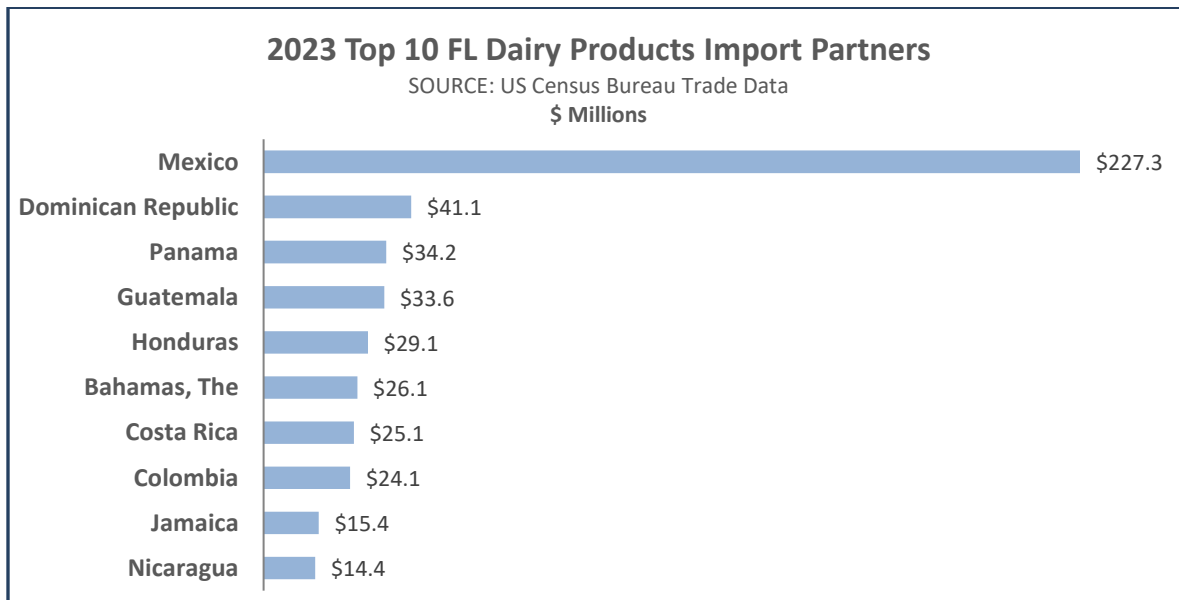


Figure 12 – 2023 Top 10 FL Dairy Products Export Partners

Mexico is Florida’s leading Dairy Products export partner with over 36.7% of all Dairy Products exported from Florida (Figure 12). Mexico primarily imports powdered milk from Florida. Mexico’s import of Florida Dairy Products has decreased by 34.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 479.5% over 2014.

2) Seafood Products

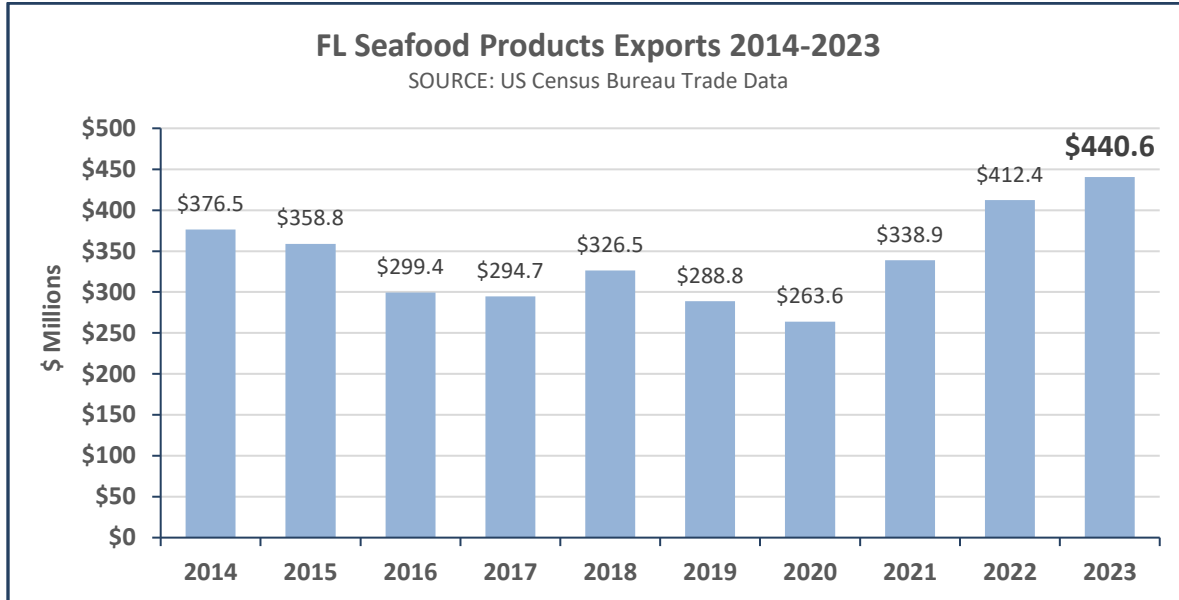


Figure 13 – 2014-2023 FL Seafood Products Exports

Florida Seafood Products include fish, shrimp, crabs, lobsters, and other seafood related products. Florida Seafood Products exports for 2023 were \$440.6 million and have increased by 6.8% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 17.0% over 2014 (Figure 13).

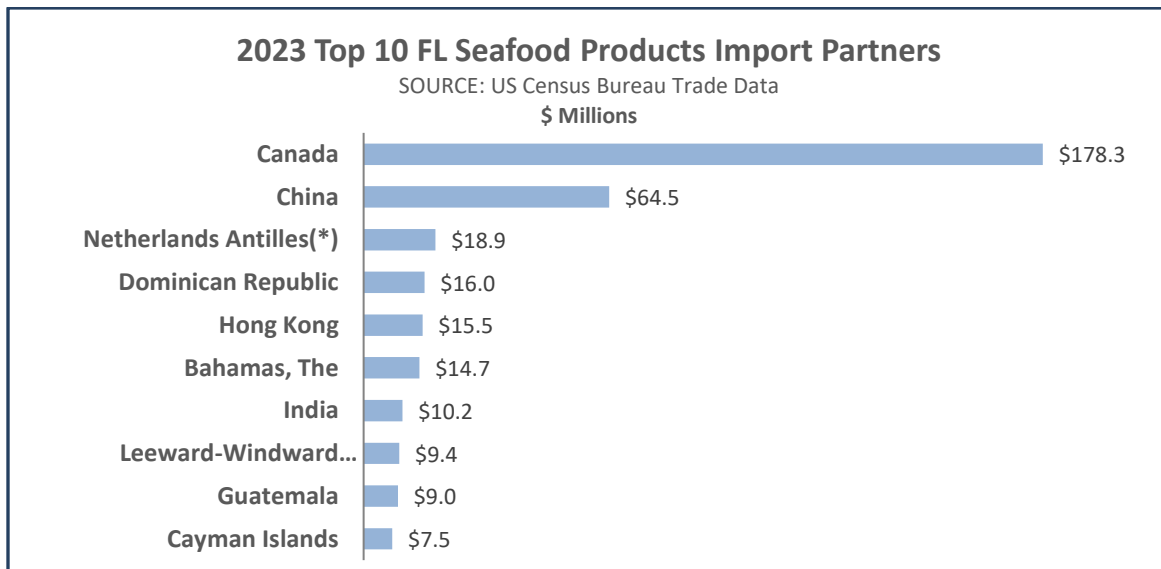


Figure 14 – 2023 Top 10 FL Seafood Products Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Seafood Products export partner with over 40.5% of all Seafood Products exported from Florida (Figure 14). Canada primarily imports Atlantic salmon, tilapia, trout, mackerel, and shrimp from Florida. Canada’s import of Florida Seafood Products has increased by 18.9% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 26.3% over 2014.

3) Beef and Beef Products

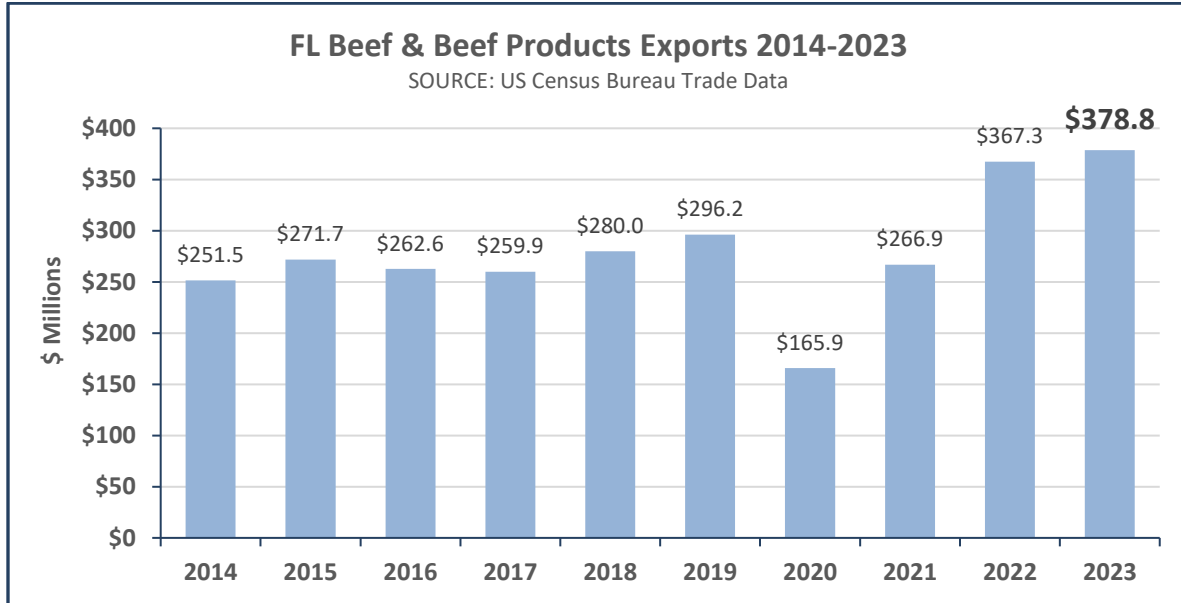


Figure 15 – 2014-2023 FL Beef & Beef Products Exports

Florida Beef and Beef Products include beef meat, offal, bone, liver, and other beef products. Florida Beef and Beef Products exports have increased by 3.1% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 50.6% over 2014 (Figure 15).

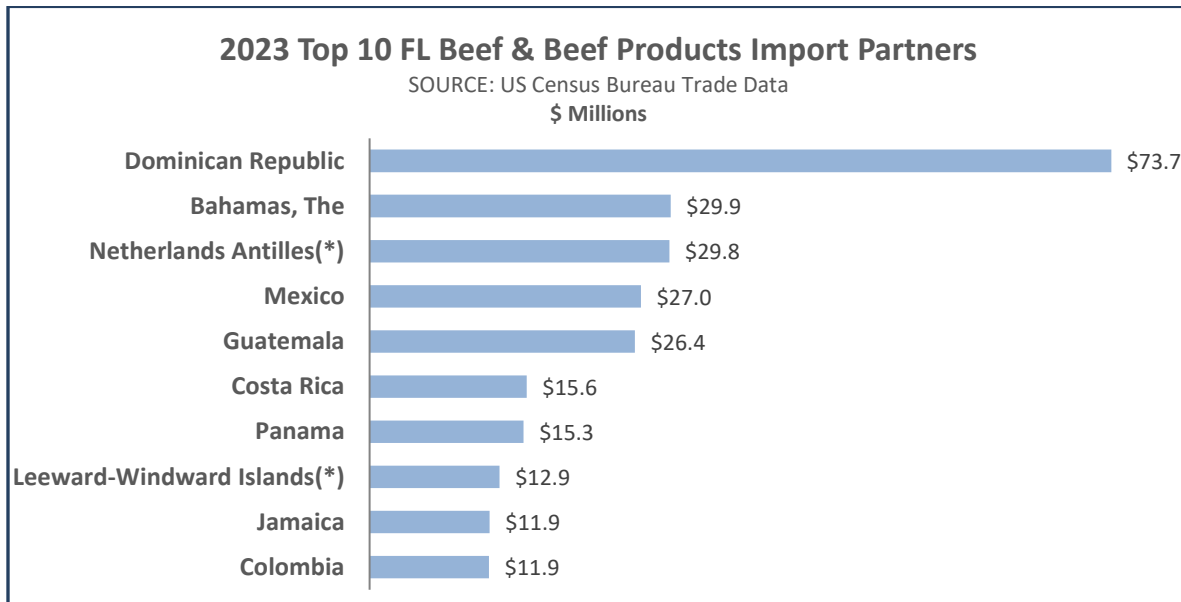


Figure 16 – 2023 Top 10 FL Beef & Beef Products Export Partners

The Dominican Republic is Florida’s leading Beef and Beef Products export partner with 19.5% of all Beef and Beef Products exported from Florida (Figure 16). The Dominican Republic primarily imports beef meat, bone, and offal from Florida. The Dominican Republic’s import of Florida Beef and Beef Products has increased by 3.5% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 94.3% over 2014.

4) Poultry Meat and Products (Excluding Eggs)

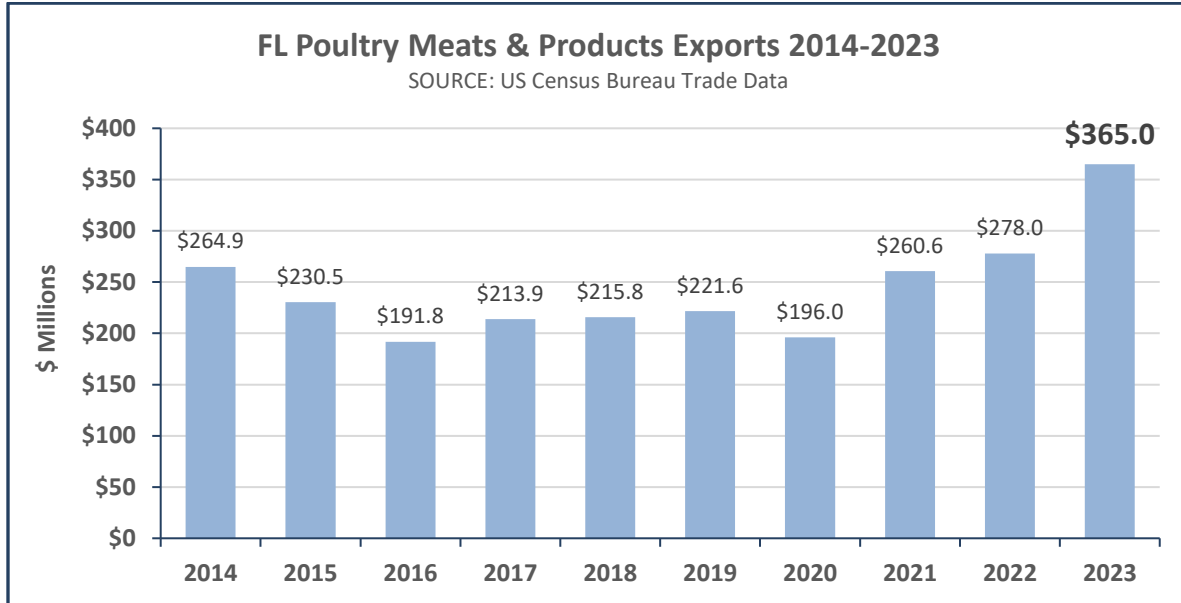


Figure 17 – 2014-2023 FL Poultry Meat & Products Exports

Florida Poultry Meat and Products include whole, cuts, offal and other poultry products from chicken, turkey, duck, and geese. Florida Poultry Meat and Products exports have increased by 31.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 37.8% over 2014 (Figure 17).

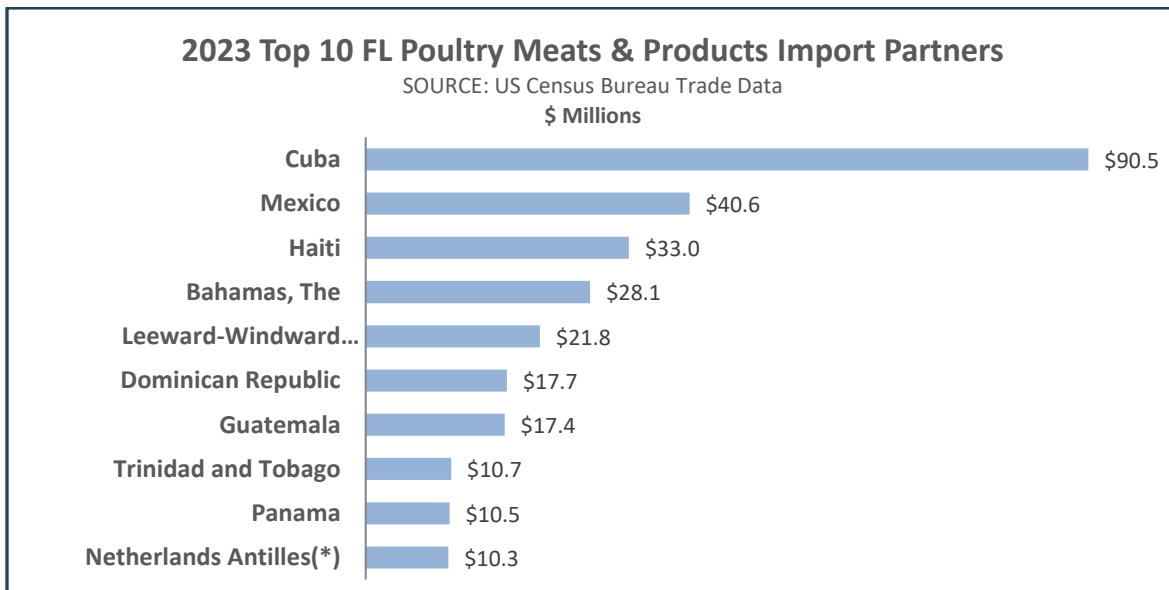


Figure 18 – 2023 Top 10 FL Poultry Meat & Products Export Partners

Cuba is Florida’s leading Poultry Meats and Products export partner with 24.8% of all Poultry Meat and Products exported from Florida (Figure 18). Cuba primarily imports whole and cuts of frozen chicken and prepared chicken meat from Florida. Cuba’s import of Florida Poultry Meats and Products has decreased by 700.5% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 243.5% over 2014.

5) Soups and Other Food Preparations

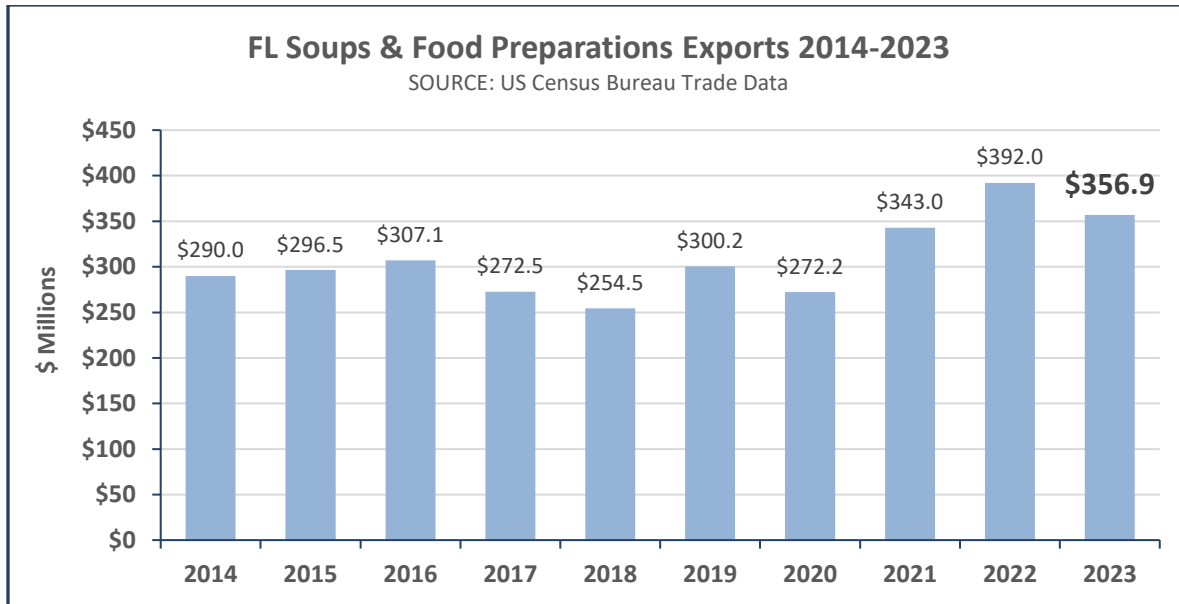


Figure 19 – 2014-2023 FL Soups & Food Preparations Exports

Florida Soups and Other Food Preparation exports, which include food prep, baby food, soups, and broths, have decreased by 9.0% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 23.0% over 2014 (Figure 19).

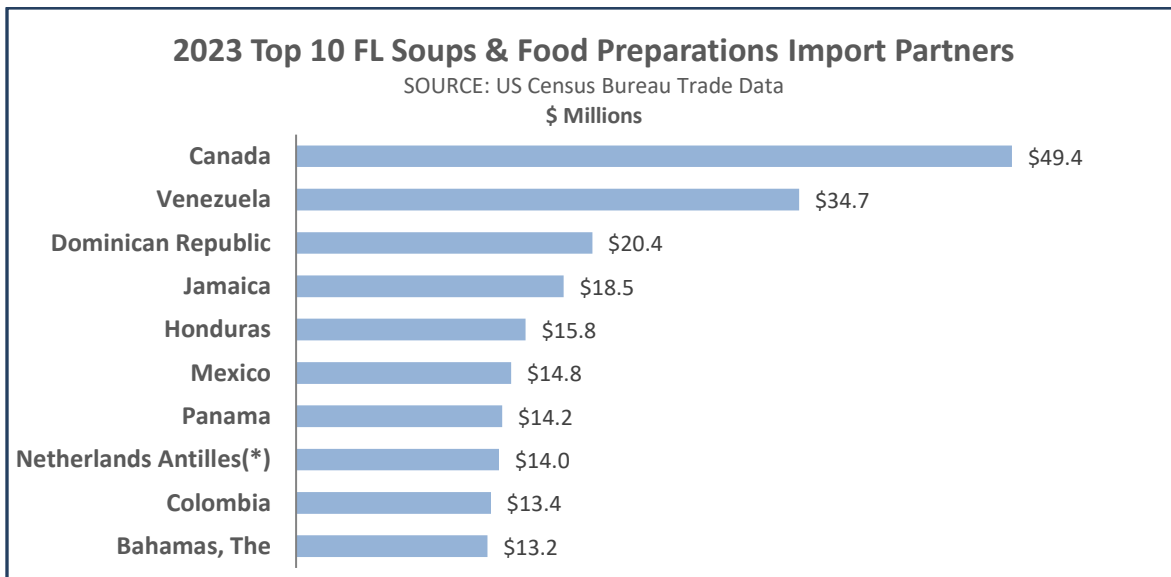


Figure 20 – 2023 Top 10 FL Soups & Food Preparations Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Soups and Other Food Preparations export partner with over 13.8% of all Soups and Other Food Preparations exported from Florida (Figure 20). Both Canada and Venezuela primarily import Florida Soups and Food Preparations from Florida in the form of soups, broths, and baby food. Canada’s import of Florida Soups and Other Food Preparations has increased by 13.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 144.8% over 2014.

6) Fresh Fruits

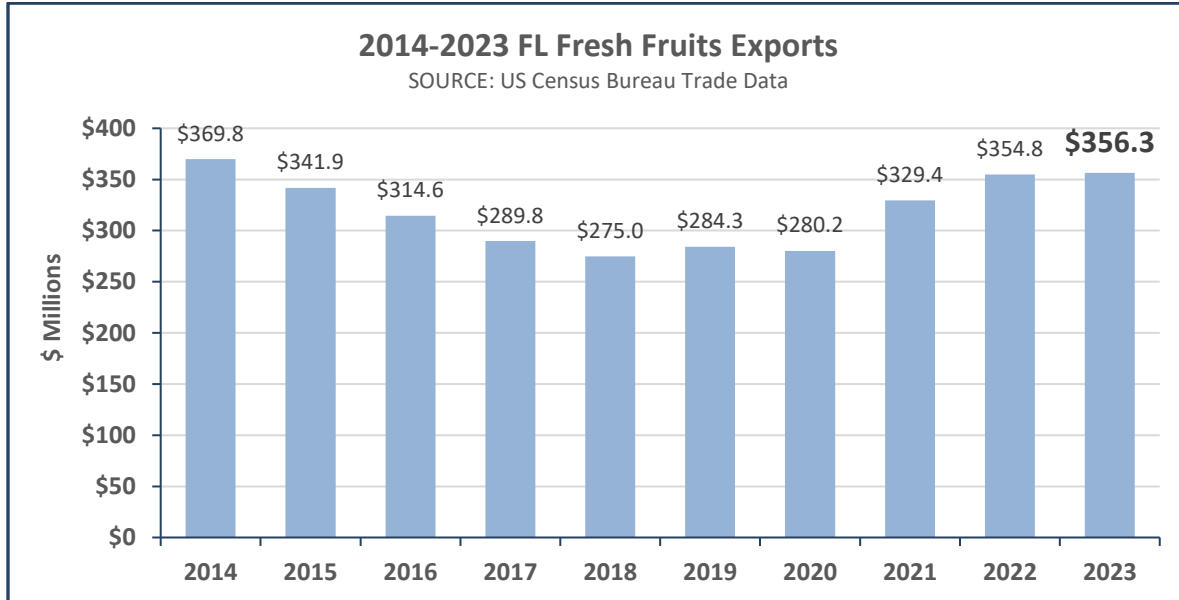


Figure 21 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Fruits Exports

Florida Fresh Fruits include strawberries, watermelons, blueberries, melons, grapefruits, and oranges. Florida Fresh Fruits exports have increased by 0.4% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 3.7% over 2014 (Figure 21).

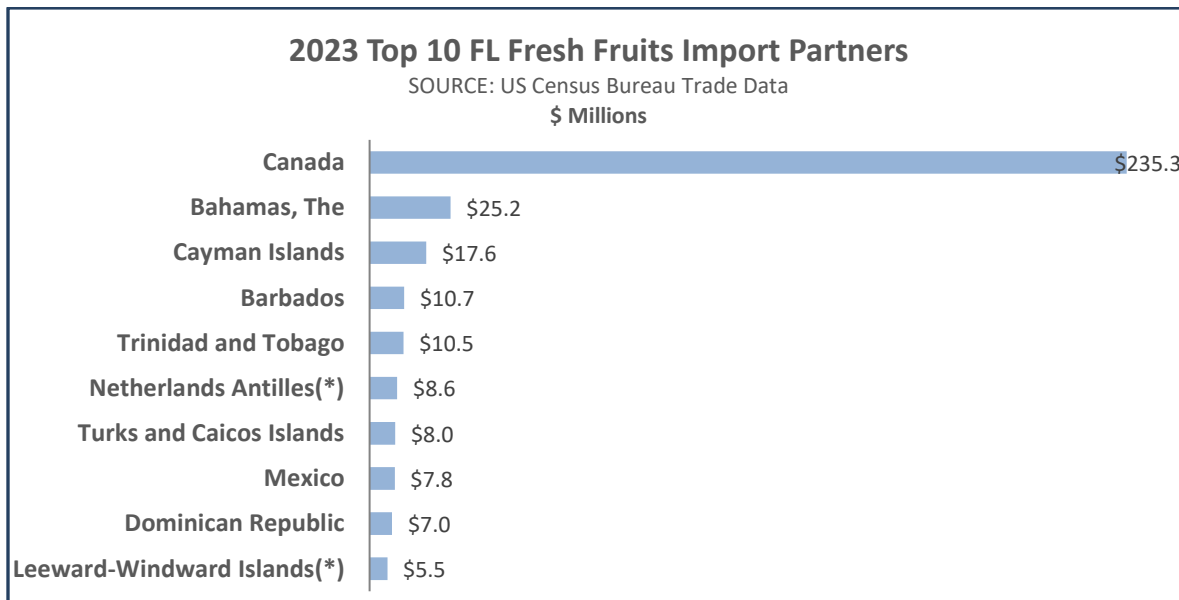


Figure 22 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Fruits Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Fresh Fruits export partner with 66.0% of all Fresh Fruits exported from Florida (Figure 22). Canada primarily imports strawberries, watermelons, blueberries, and melons from Florida. Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Fruits has decreased by 3.0% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 2.2% over 2014.

Fresh Strawberries

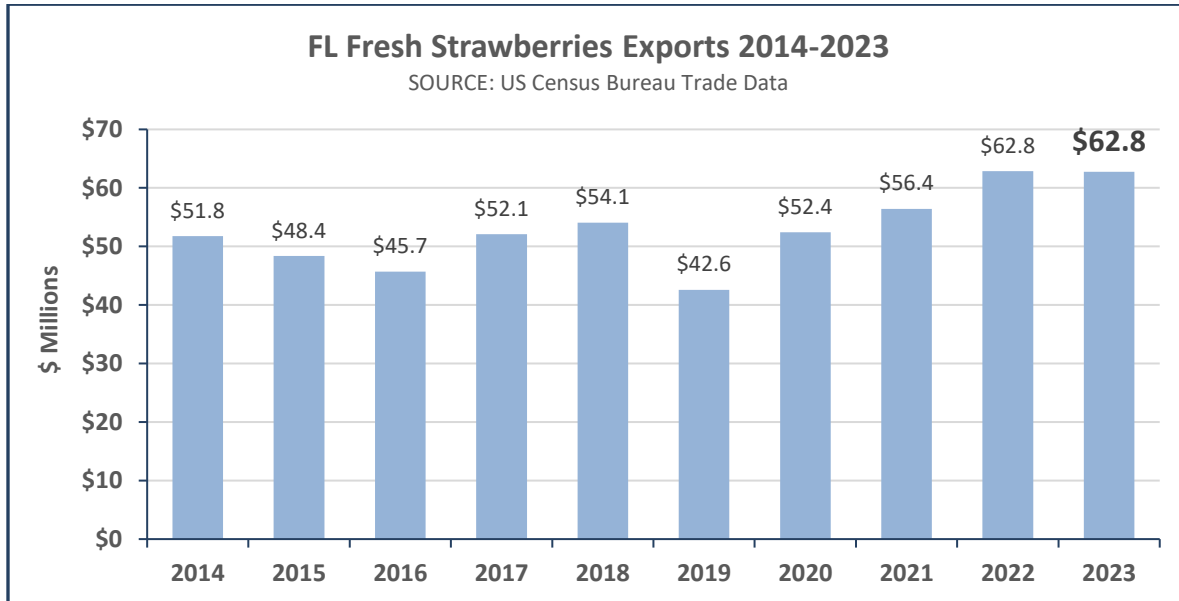


Figure 23 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Strawberries Exports

Florida Fresh Strawberries exports have decreased by 0.1% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 21.2% over 2014 (Figure 23).

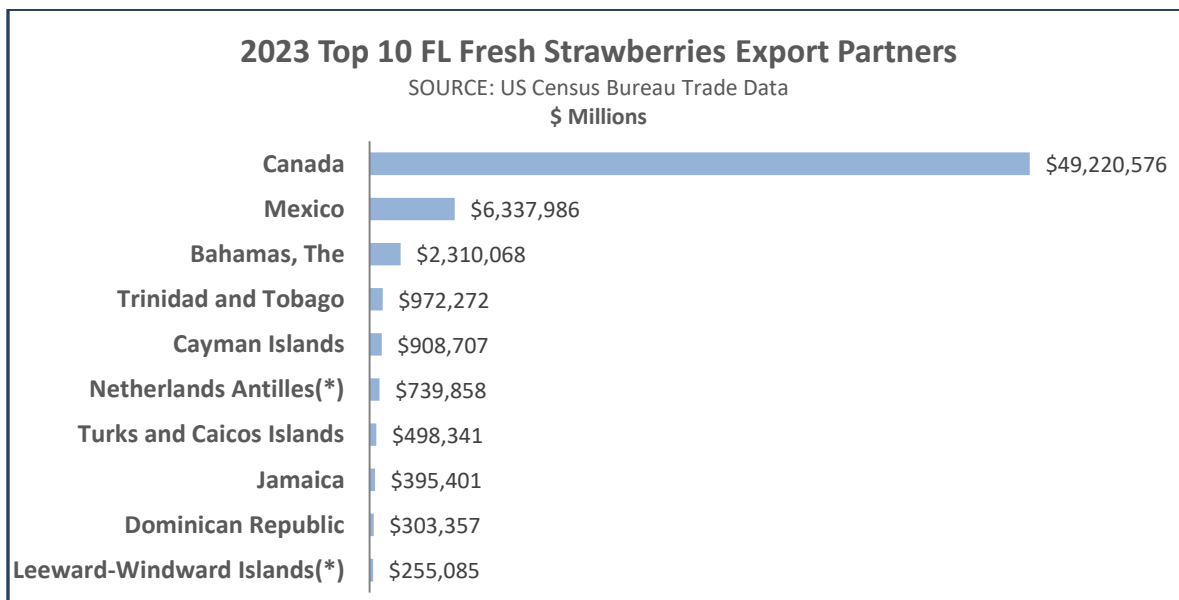


Figure 24 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Strawberries Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Fresh Strawberries export partner with 78.4% of all Fresh Strawberries exported from Florida (Figure 24). Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Strawberries has decreased by 4.5% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 4.0% over 2014.

Fresh Watermelons

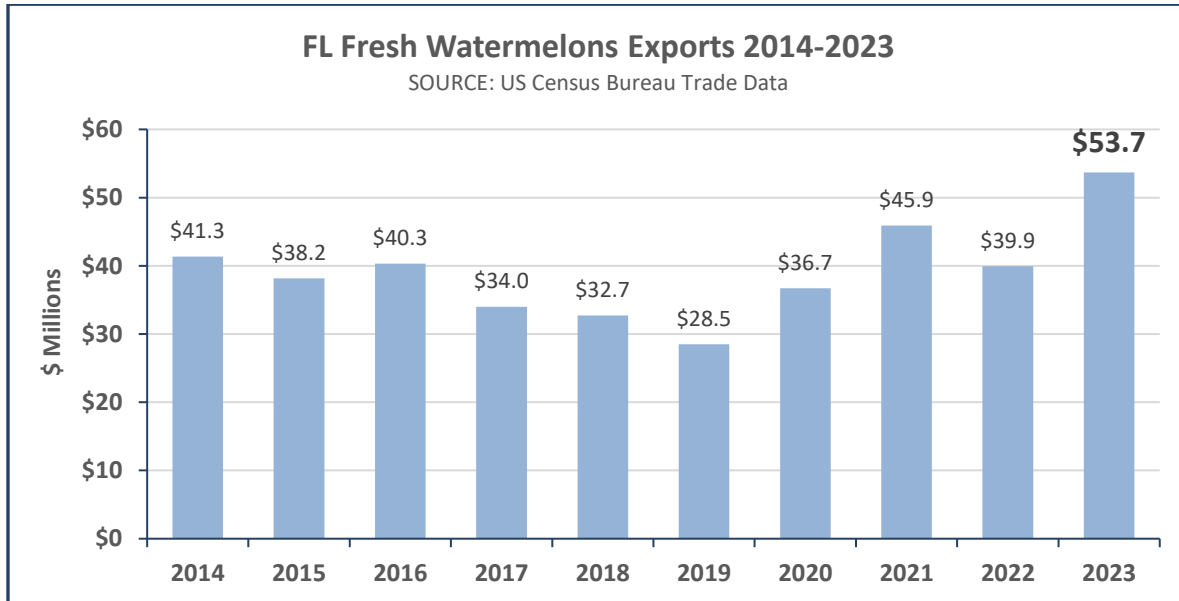


Figure 25 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Watermelons Exports

Florida Fresh Watermelons exports have increased by 34.4% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 29.8% over 2014 (Figure 25).

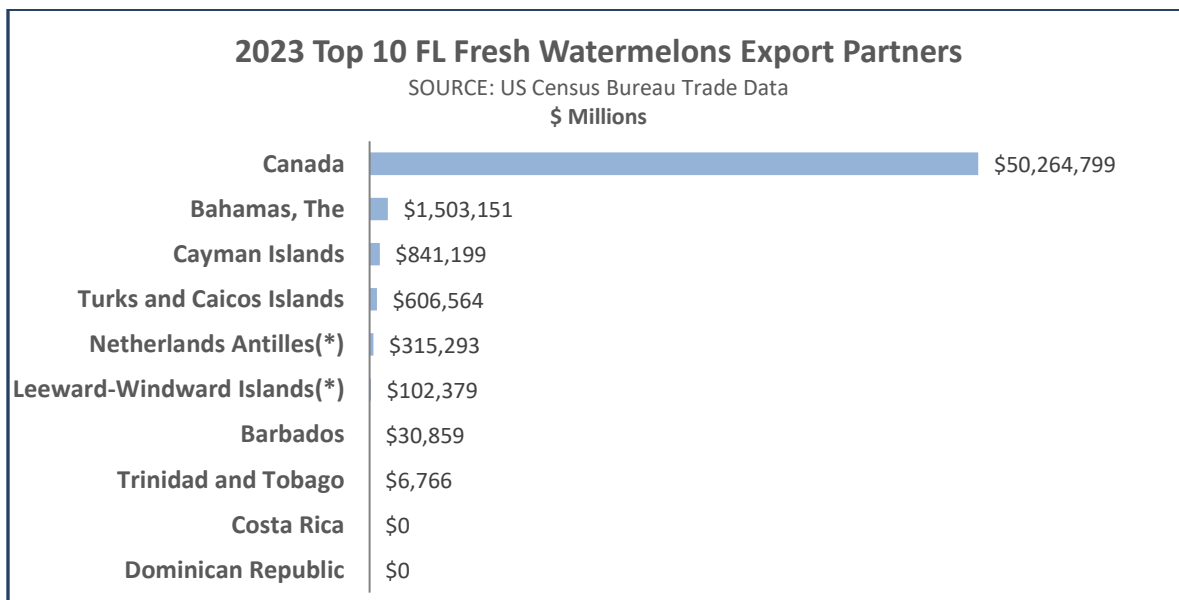


Figure 26 – 2023 Top 10 Florida Fresh Watermelons Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Fresh Watermelons export partner with 93.7% of all Fresh Watermelons exported from Florida (Figure 26). Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Watermelons has increased by 35.1% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 22.8% over 2014.

Fresh Blueberries

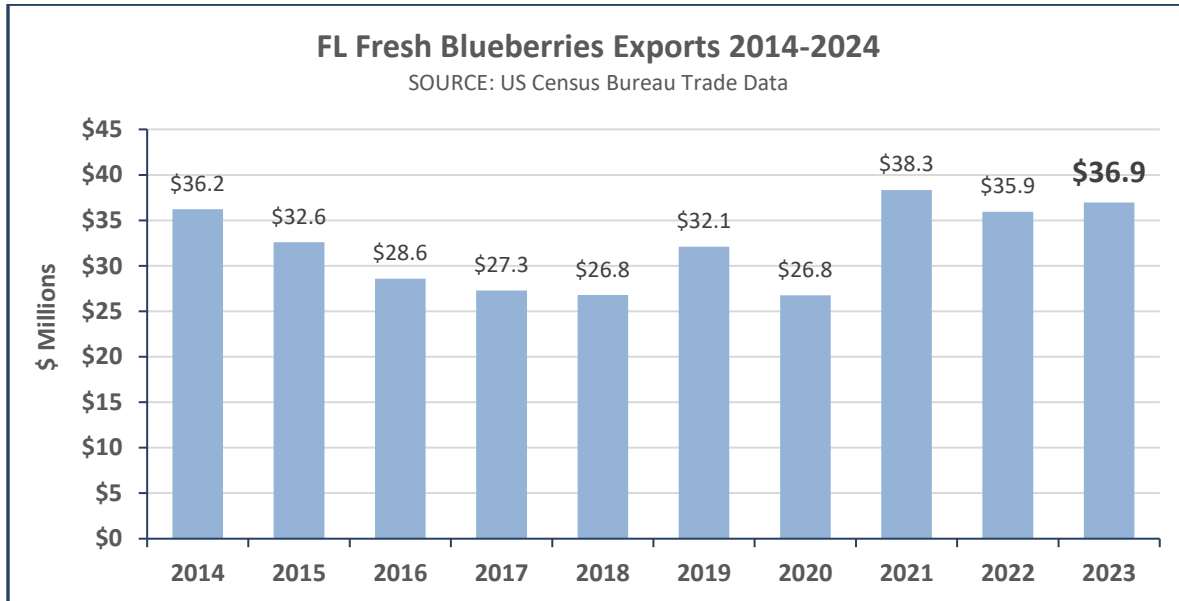


Figure 27 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Blueberries Exports

Florida Fresh Blueberries exports have increased by 2.8% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 2.0% over 2014 (Figure 27).

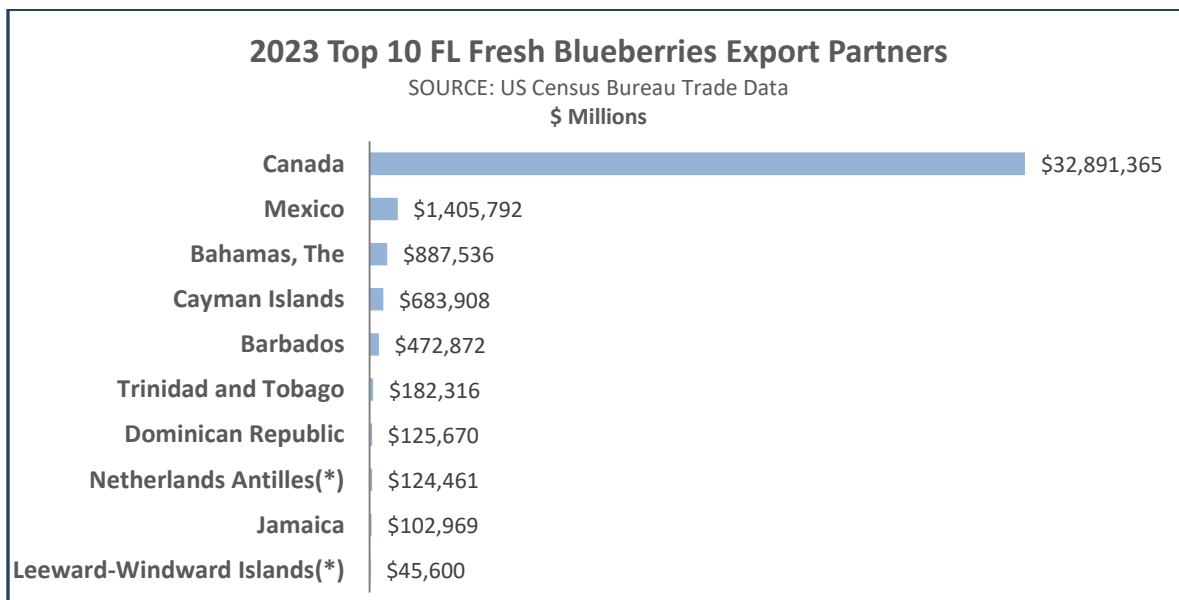


Figure 28 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Blueberries Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Fresh Blueberries export partner with 89.0% of all Fresh Blueberries exported from Florida (Figure 28). Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Blueberries has decreased by 3.0% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 6.0% over 2014.

Fresh Melons (Excluding Watermelons)

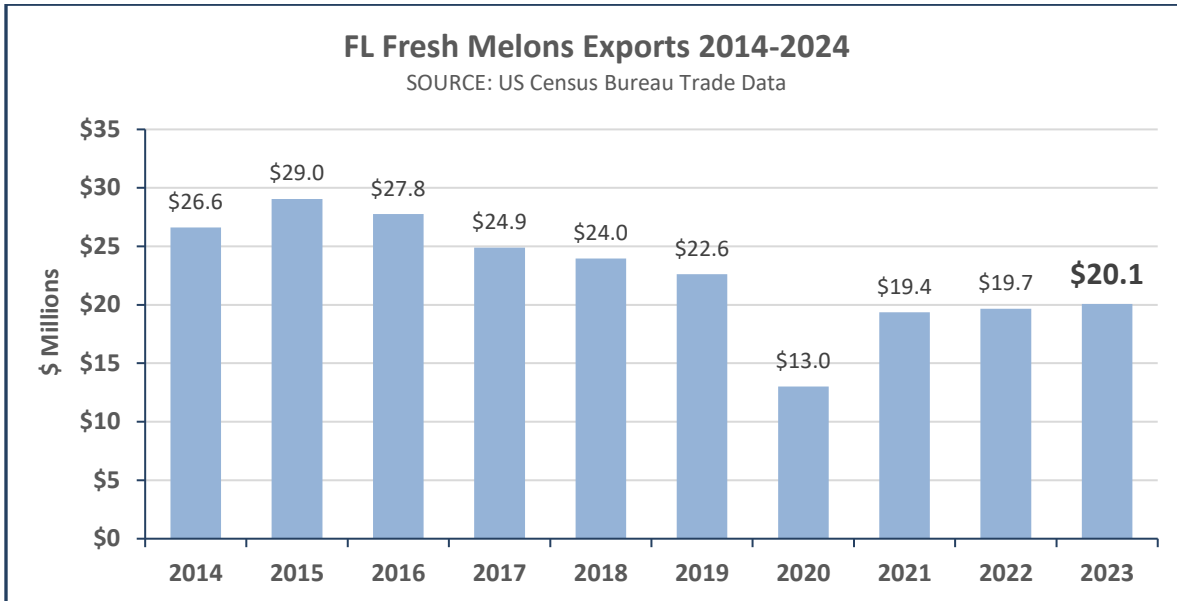


Figure 29 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Melons Exports

Florida Fresh Melons exports have increased by 2.0% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 24.6% over 2014 (Figure 29).

Canada is Florida’s leading Fresh Melons export partner with 89.1% of all Fresh Melons exported from Florida (Figure 30). Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Melons has increased by 2.9% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 28.6% over 2014.

Fresh Grapefruits

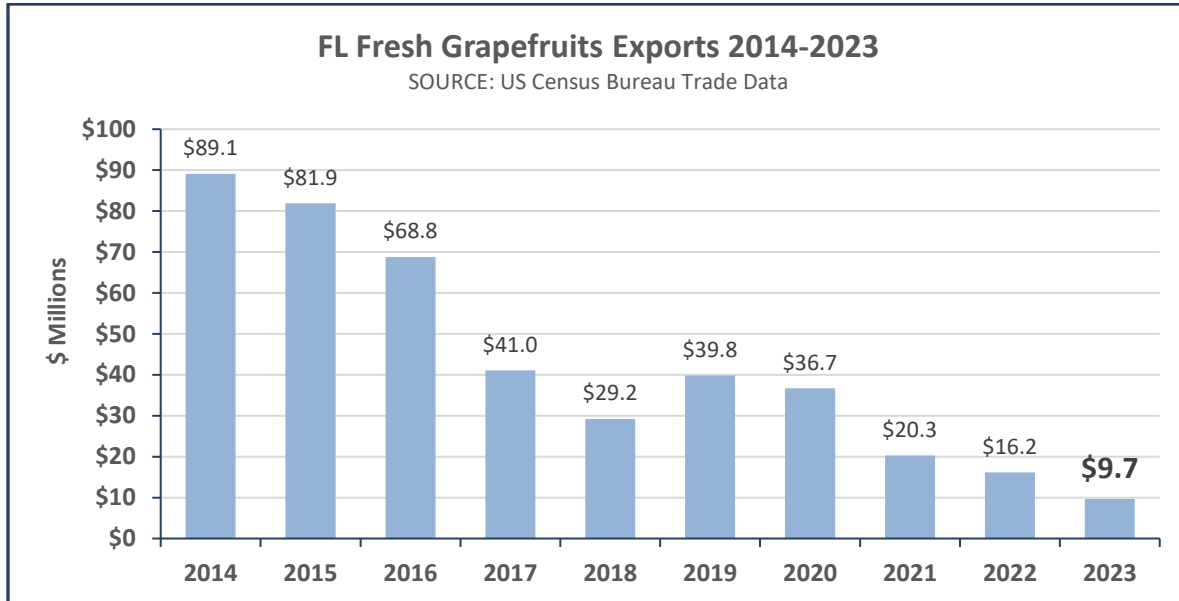


Figure 31 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Grapefruits Exports

Florida Fresh Grapefruits exports have decreased by 40.3% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 89.2% over 2014 (*Figure 31*). Japan decreased imports of Florida Grapefruits by 96.7% in 2023 (\$1.3 million) over 2014 (\$39.0 million), which directly affects the decline in FL Grapefruits exports from 2014 to 2023.

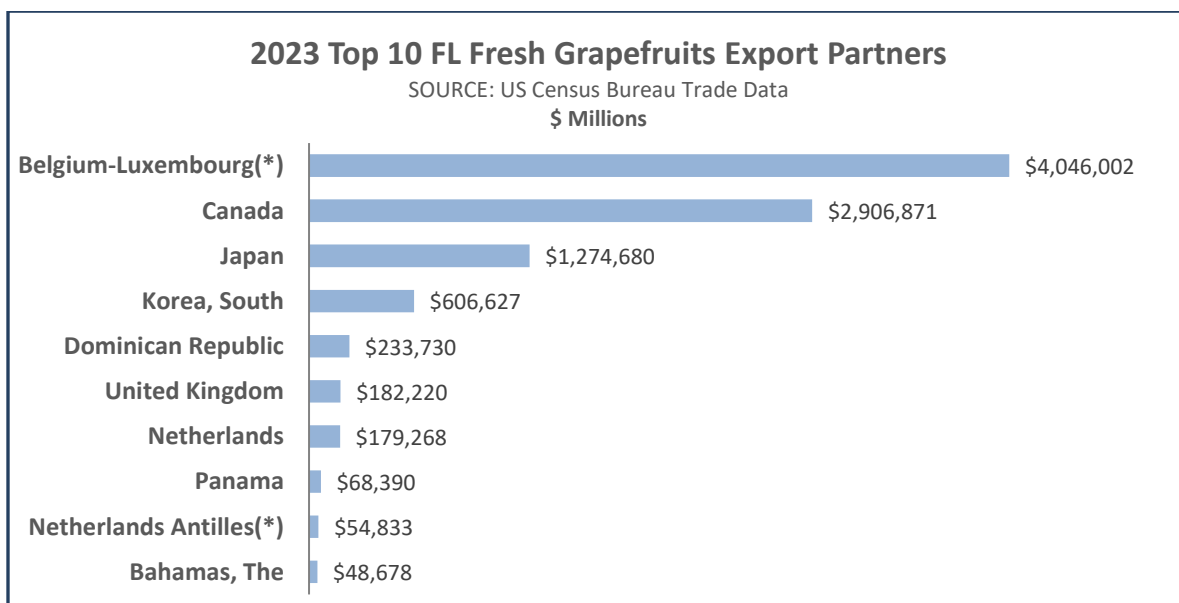


Figure 32 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Grapefruits Export Partners

Belgium-Luxembourg is Florida’s leading Fresh Grapefruits export partner with 41.9% of all Fresh Grapefruits exported from Florida (*Figure 32*). Belgium-Luxembourg’s import of Florida Fresh Grapefruits has decreased by 20.0% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 22.9% over 2014.

Fresh Oranges

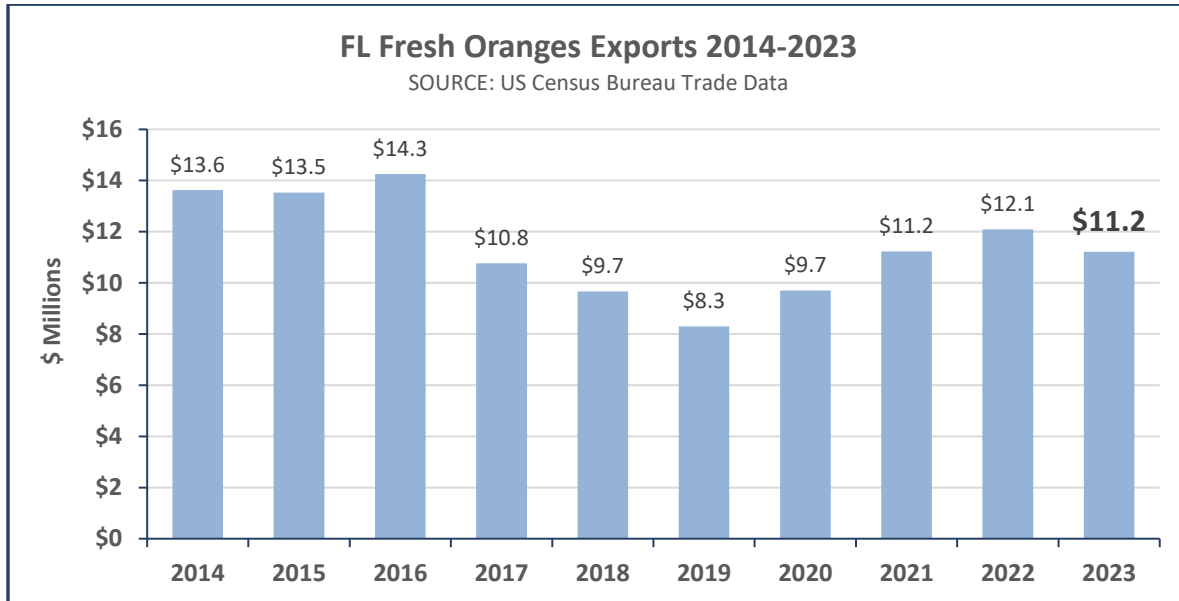


Figure 33 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Oranges Exports

Florida Fresh Oranges exports have decreased by 7.3% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 17.7% over 2014 (Figure 33).

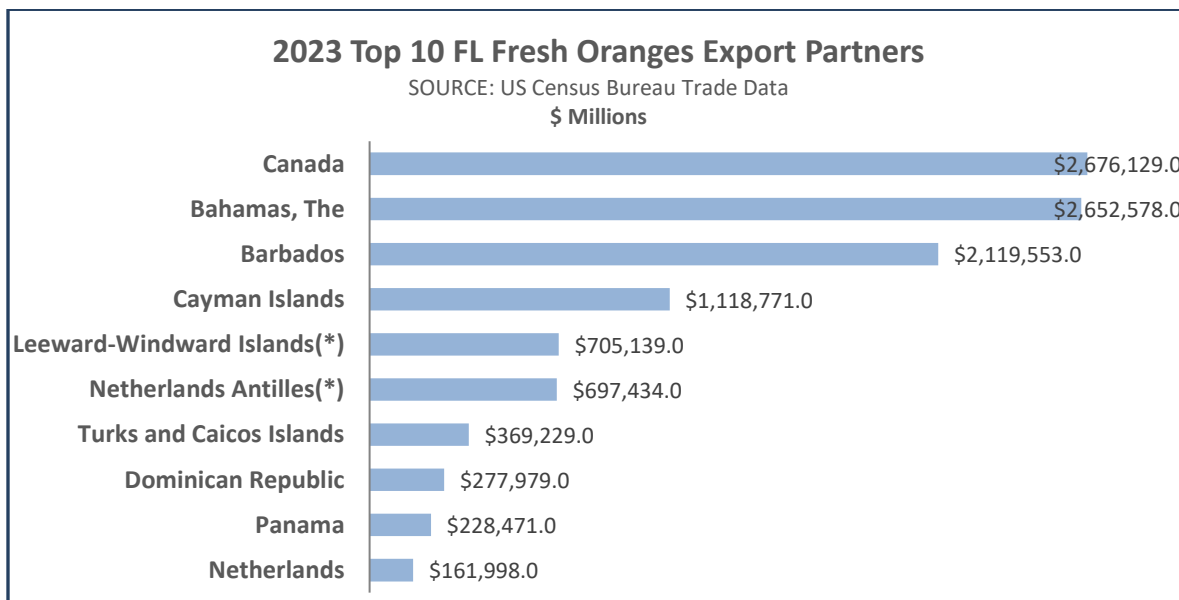


Figure 34 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Oranges Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Fresh Oranges export partner with 23.9% of all Fresh Oranges exported from Florida (Figure 34). Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Oranges has decreased by 10.4% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 72.0% over 2014.

7) Forest Products

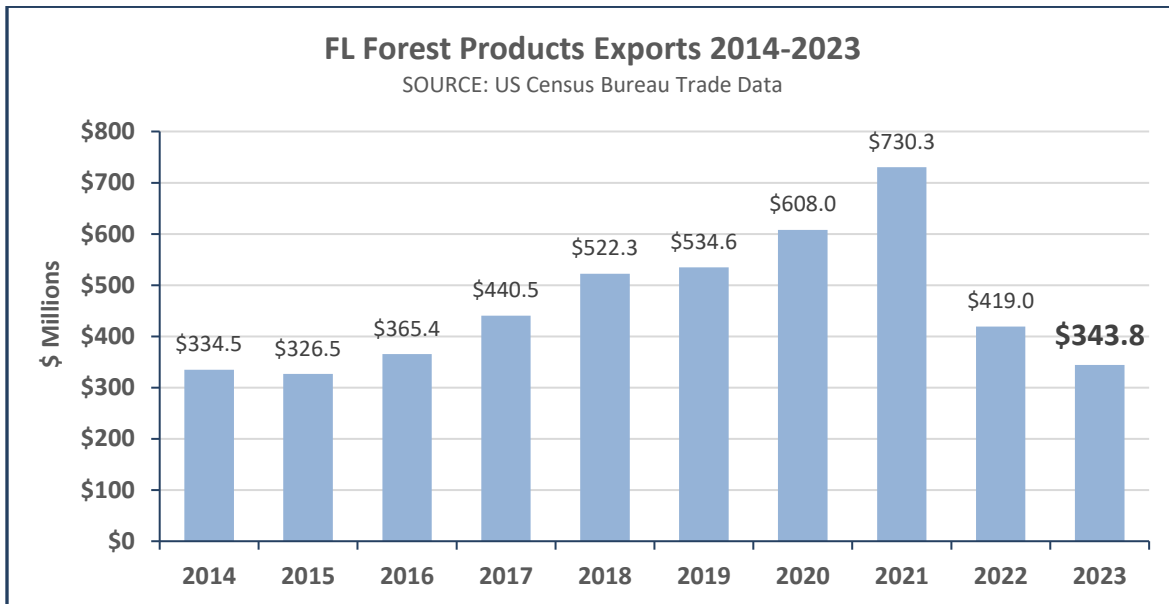


Figure 35 – 2014-2023 FL Forest Products Exports

Florida Forest Products include wood pellets, wood chips, mulch, plywood, and other wood related products. Florida Forest Products exports have decreased by 17.9% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 2.8% over 2014 (Figure 35). The Netherlands decreased imports of Florida Forest Products by 54.2% in 2023 (\$36.3 million) over 2022 (\$79.3 million), which directly affects the decline in 2023.

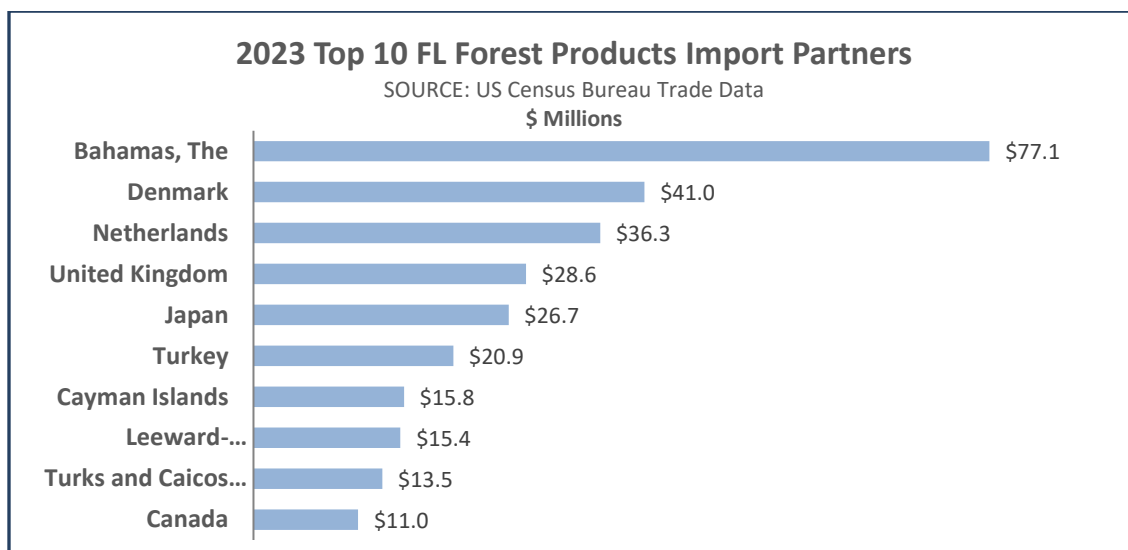


Figure 36 – 2023 Top 10 FL Forest Products Export Partners

The Bahamas is Florida’s leading Forest Products export partner with over 22.4 % of all Forest Products exported from Florida, primarily importing building materials from Florida (Figure 36). The Bahamas’ import of Florida Forest Products has decreased by 29.7% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 46.4% over 2014.

8) Distilled Spirits

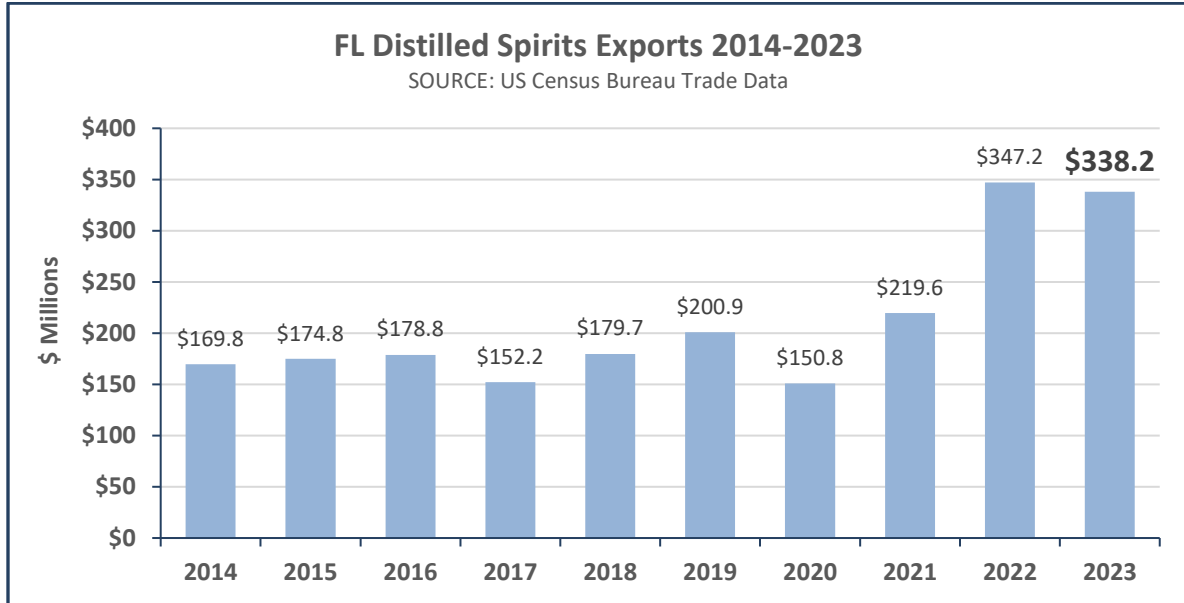


Figure 37 – 2014-2023 FL Distilled Spirits Exports

Florida Distilled Spirits include mixed spirits, rum, whiskies, brandy, vodka, liqueurs, and gin. Florida Distilled Spirits exports have decreased by 2.6% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 99.2% over 2014 (Figure 37).

Panama is Florida’s leading Distilled Spirits export partner with 10.3% of all Distilled Spirits exported from Florida (Figure 38). Panama primarily imports mixed spirits and whiskies from Florida. Panama’s import of Florida Distilled Spirits has increased by 57.9% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 29.2% over 2014.

9) Fresh Vegetables

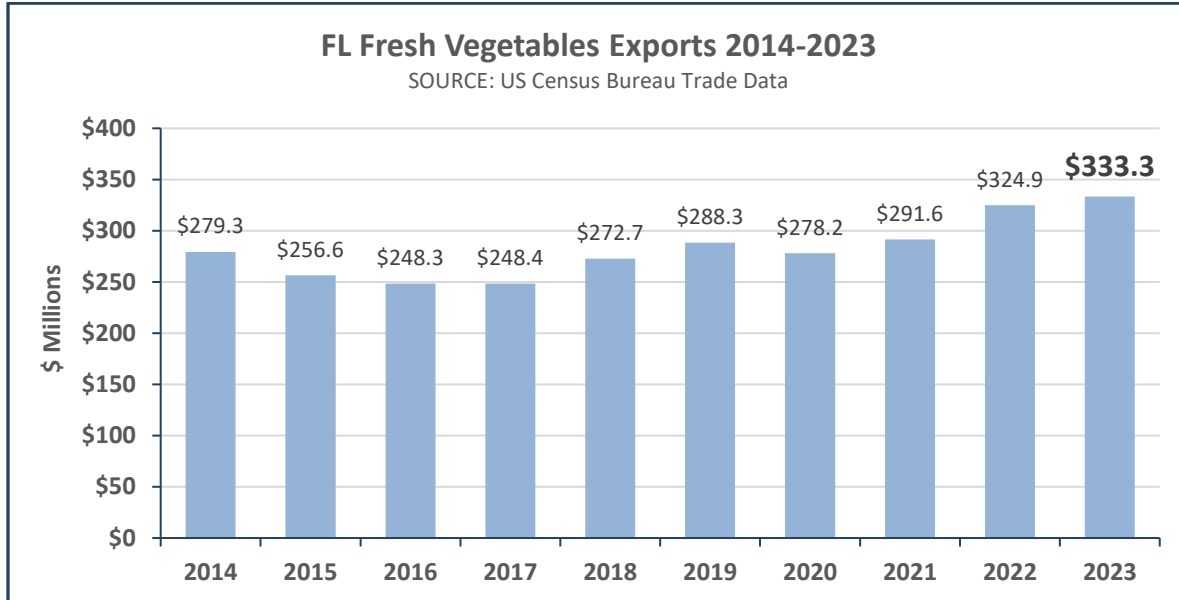


Figure 39 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Vegetables Exports

Florida Fresh Vegetables include tomatoes, peppers, lettuce, snap beans, and brassicas. Florida Fresh Vegetables exports have increased by 2.6% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 19.3% over 2014 (Figure 39).

Canada primarily imports tomatoes, peppers, snap beans, and brassicas from Florida. Canada’s import of Florida Fresh Vegetables has increased by 2.4% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 3.3% over 2014.

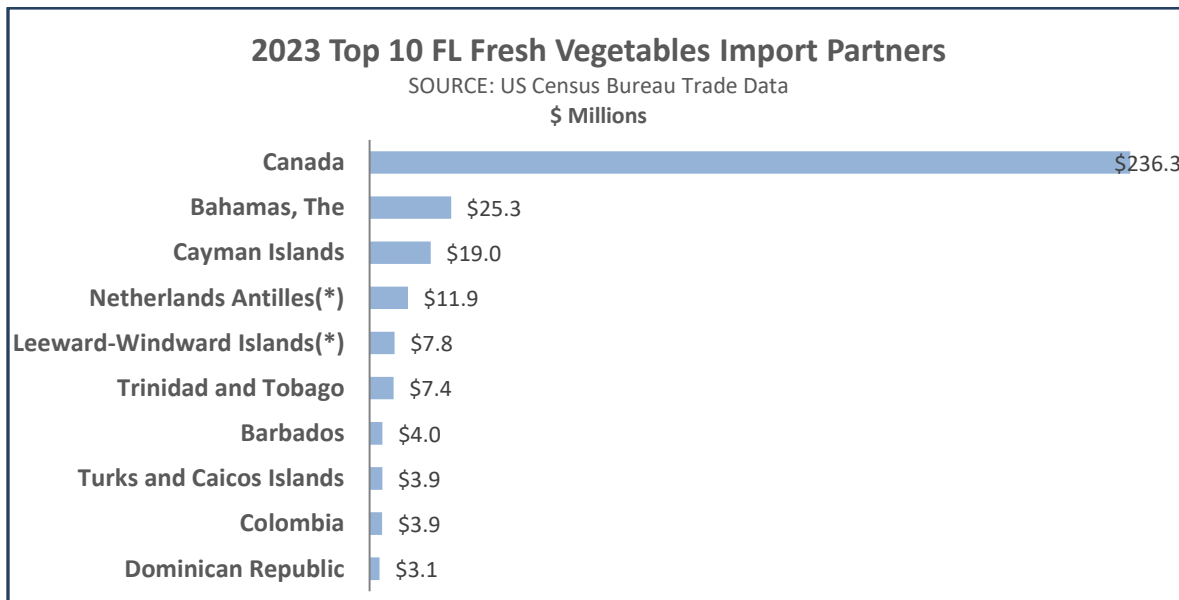


Figure 40 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Vegetables Export Partners

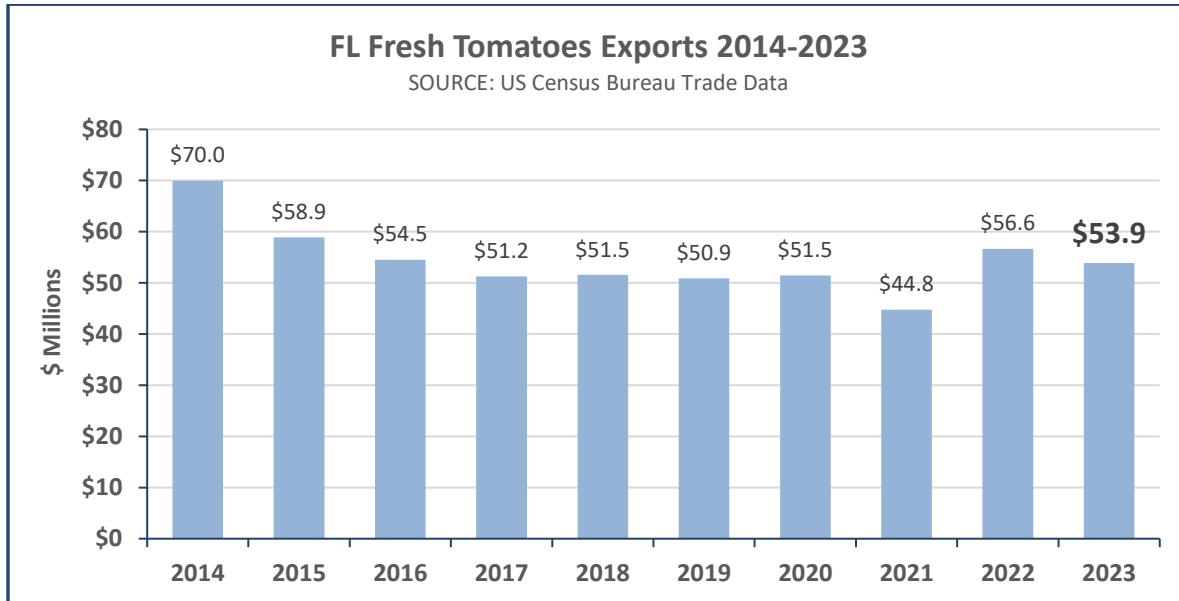


Figure 41 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Tomatoes Exports

Florida Fresh Tomatoes exports have decreased by 4.9% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 23.0% over 2014 (Figure 41).

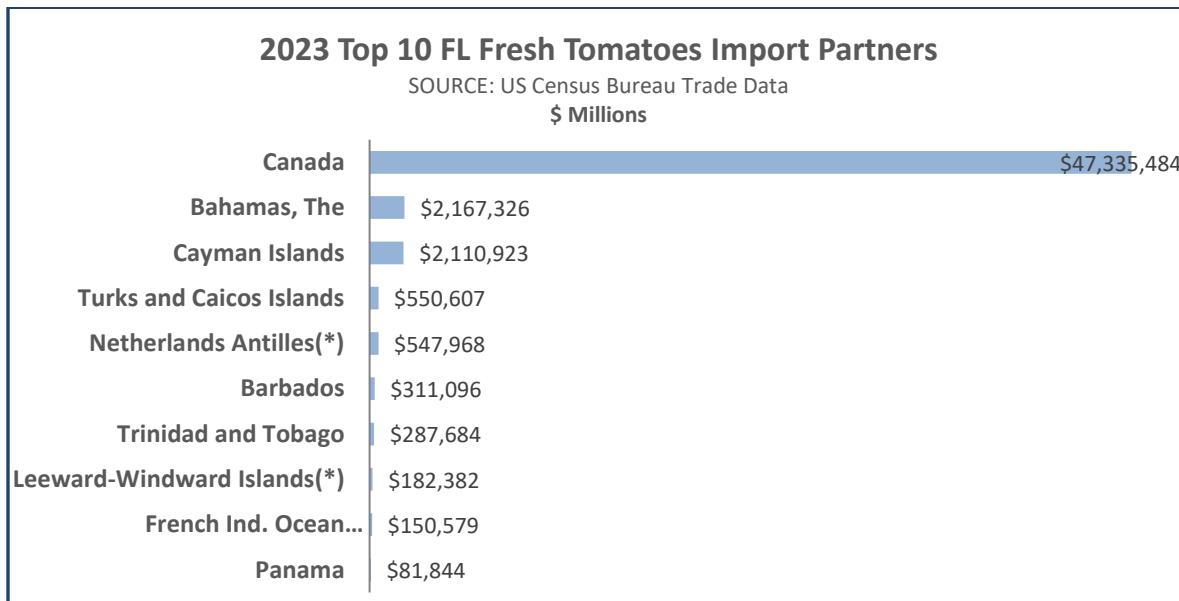


Figure 42 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Tomatoes Export Partners

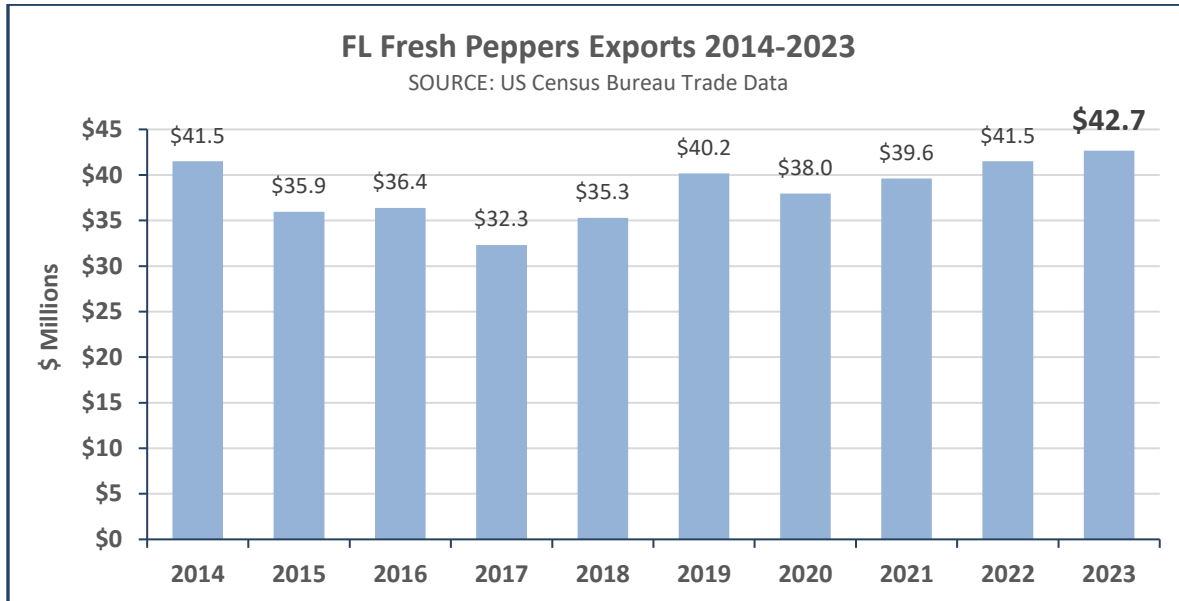


Figure 43 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Peppers Exports

Florida Fresh Peppers exports have increased by 2.9% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 2.8% over 2014 (Figure 43).

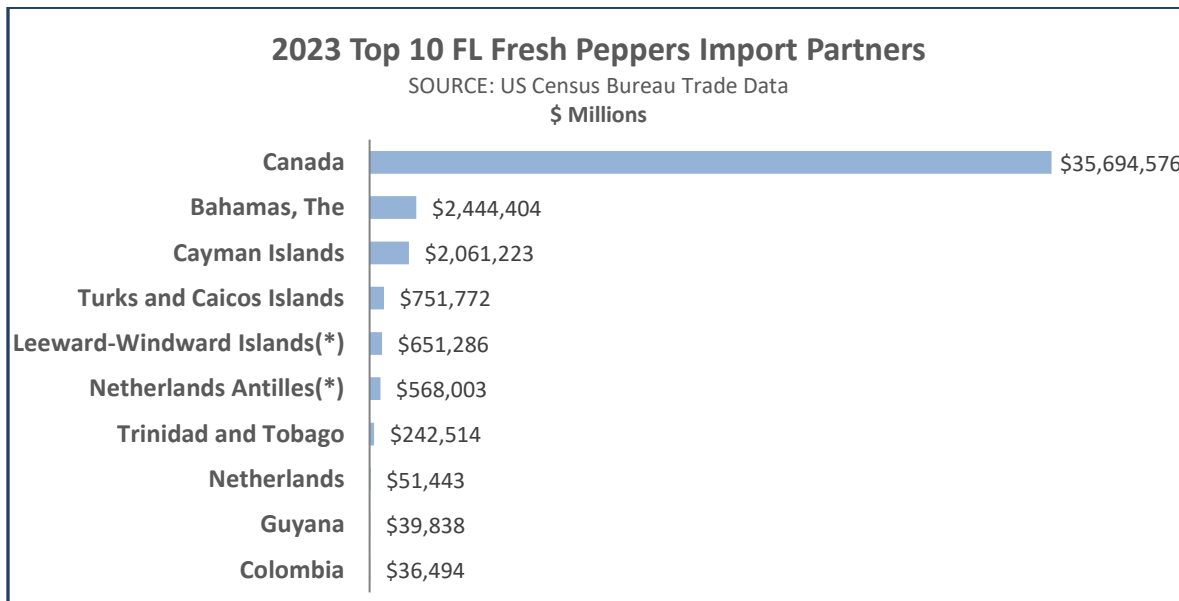


Figure 44 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Peppers Export Partners

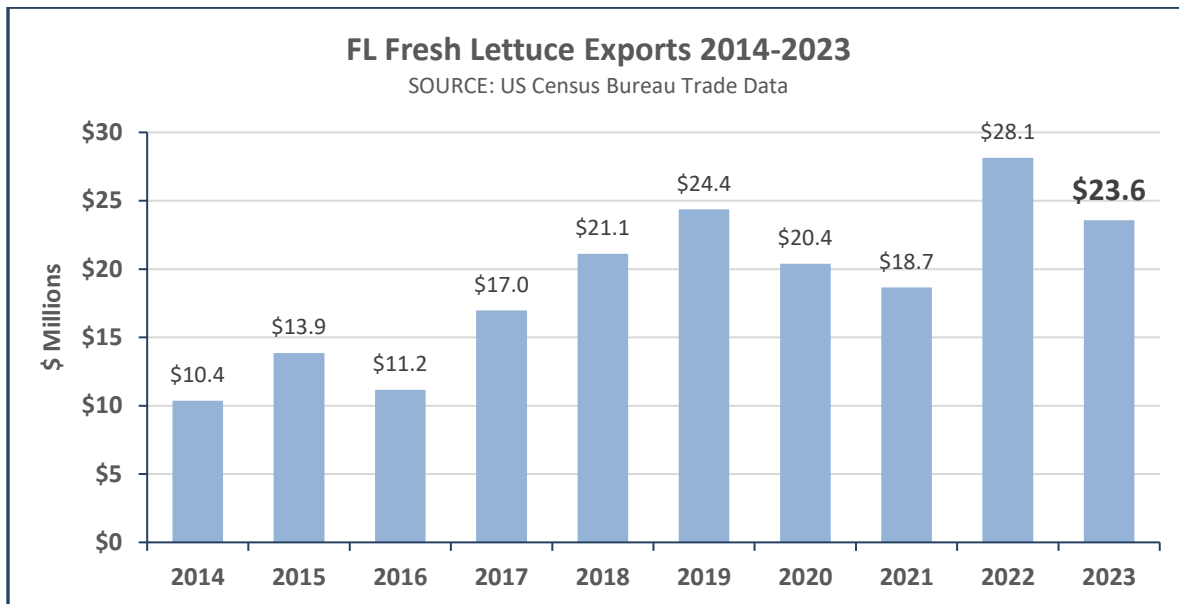


Figure 45 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Lettuce Exports

Florida Fresh Lettuce exports have decreased by 16.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 127.6% over 2014 (Figure 45).

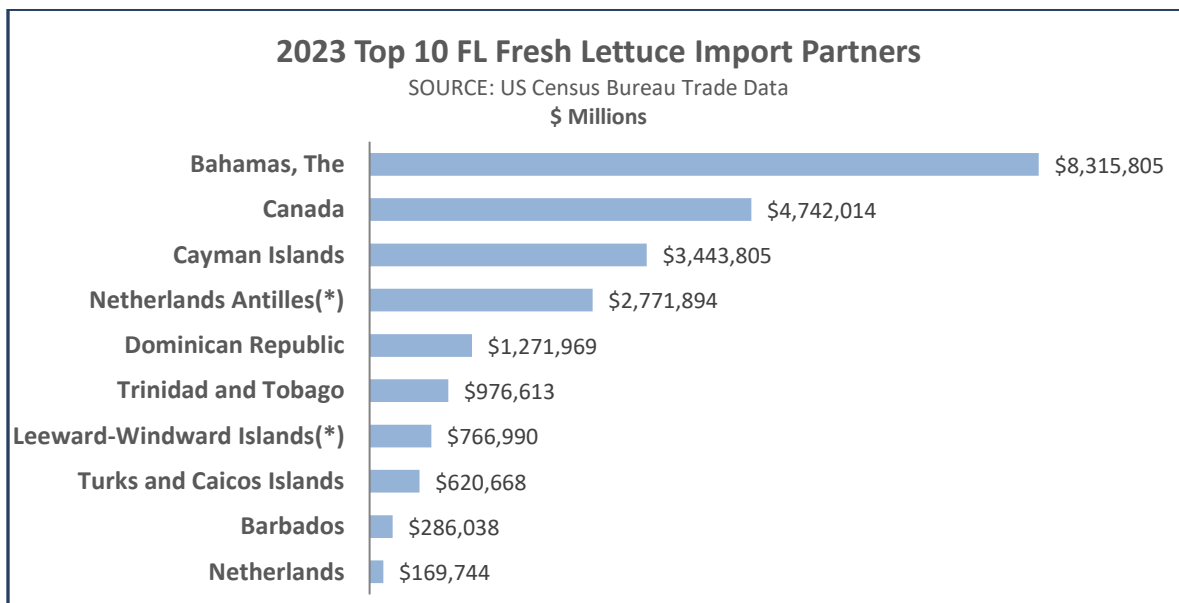


Figure 46 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Lettuce Export Partners

The Bahamas is Florida’s leading Fresh Lettuce export partner with 35.3% of all Fresh Lettuce exported from Florida (Figure 46). The Bahamas’ import of Florida Fresh Lettuce has increased by 1.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 359.1% over 2014.

Fresh Snap Beans

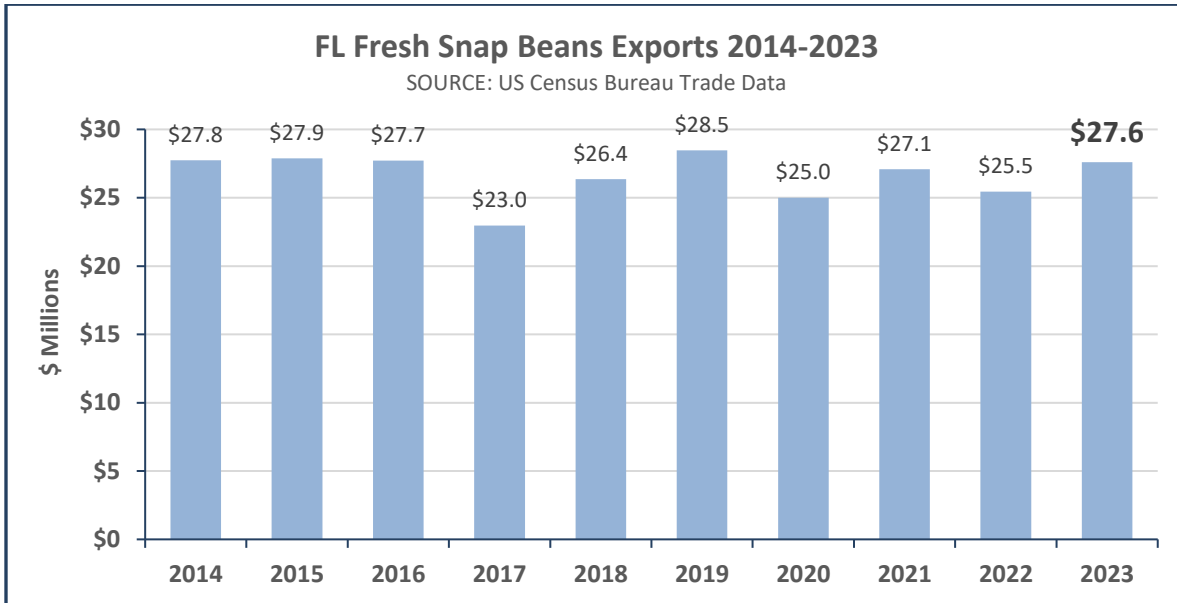


Figure 47 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Snap Beans Exports

Florida Fresh Snap Beans exports have increased by 8.4% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 0.5% over 2014 (Figure 47).

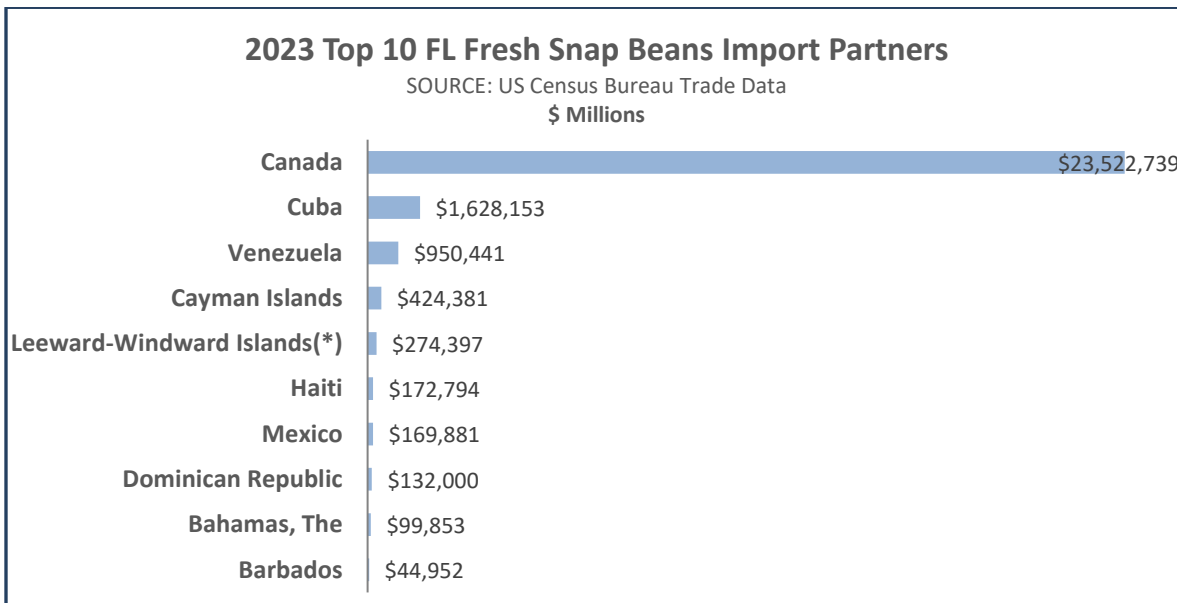


Figure 48 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Snap Beans Export Partners

Fresh Brassicas

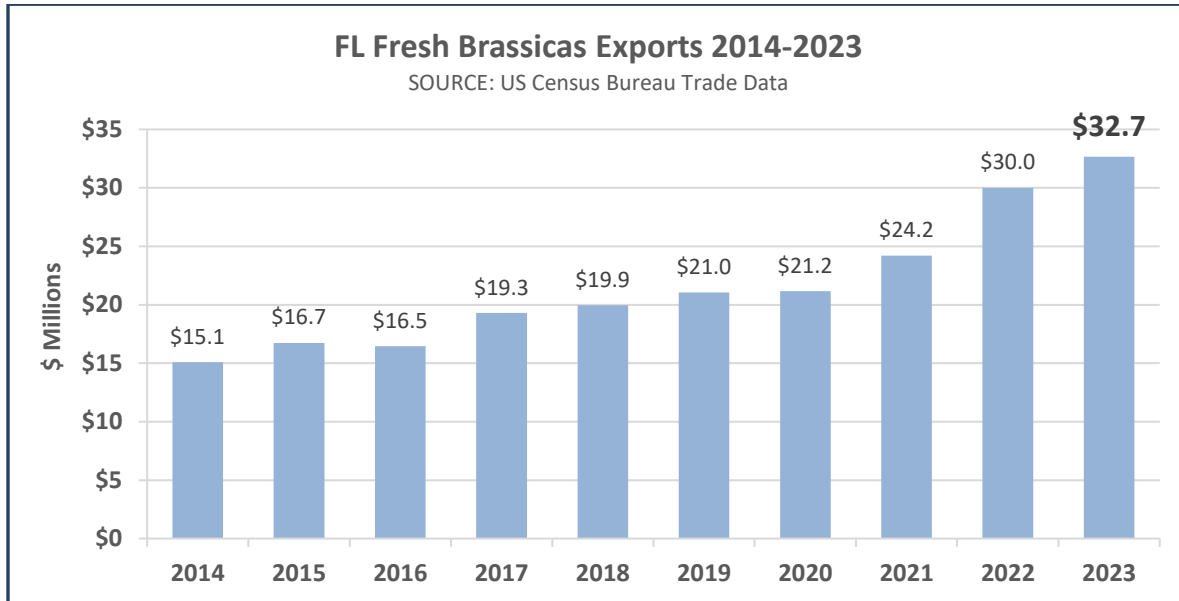


Figure 49 – 2014-2023 FL Fresh Brassicas Exports

Florida Fresh Brassicas include cabbage, cauliflower, and broccoli. Florida Fresh Brassicas exports have increased by 8.8% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 116.6% over 2014 (Figure 49).

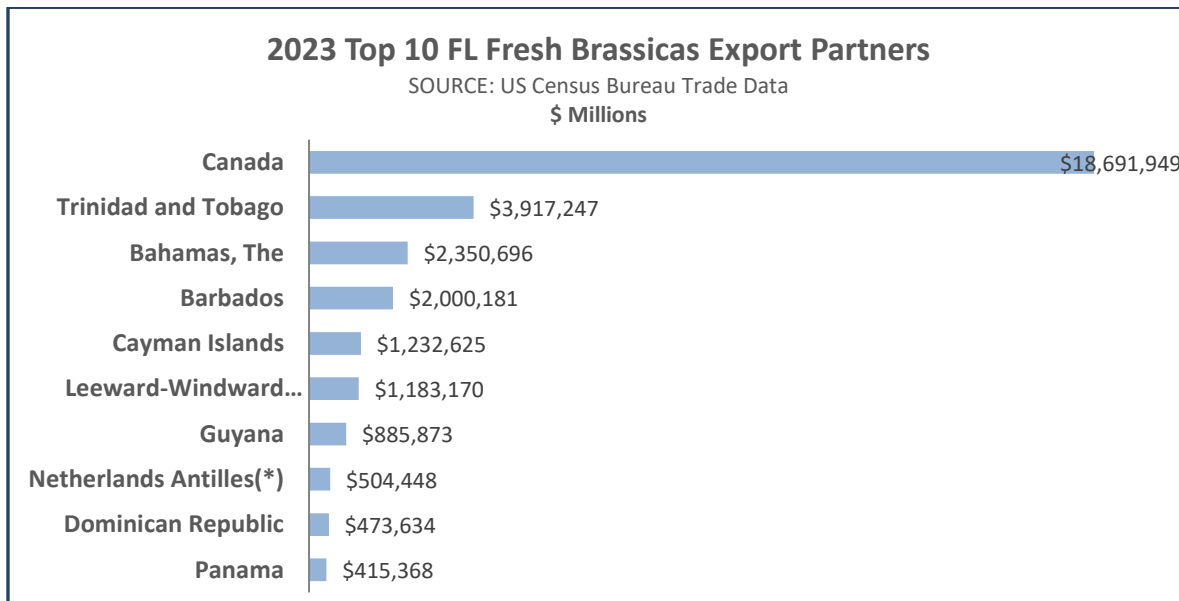


Figure 50 – 2023 Top 10 FL Fresh Brassicas Export Partners

10) Essential Oils

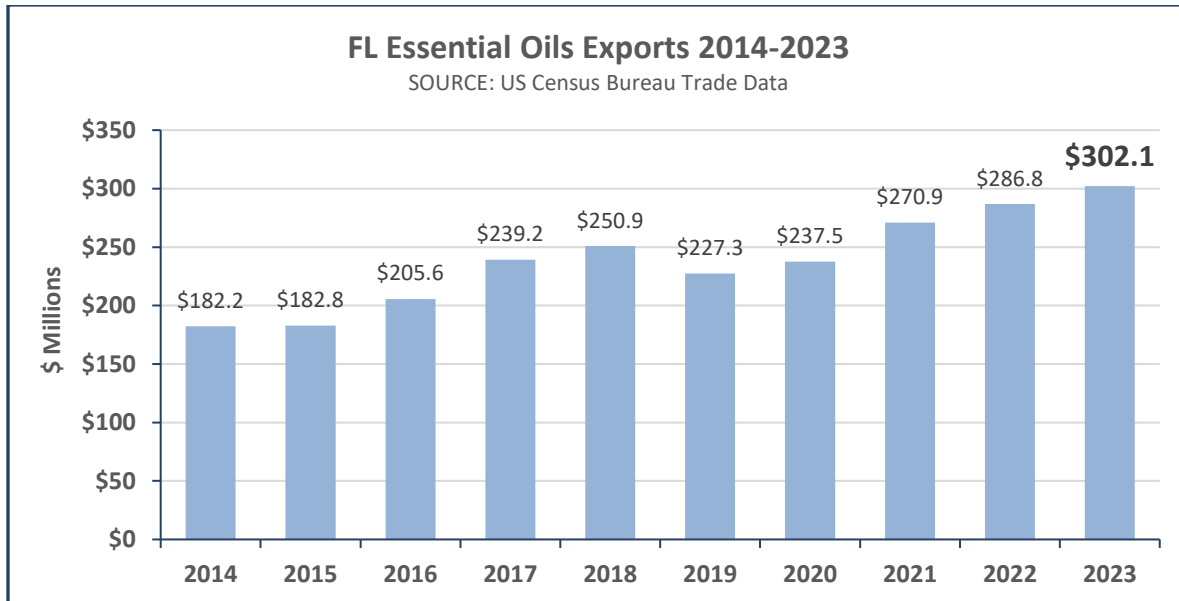


Figure 51 – 2014-2023 FL Essential Oils Exports

Florida Fresh Essential Oils include oils of orange, citrus, lemon, and peppermint. Florida Essential Oils exports have increased by 5.3% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 65.8% over 2014 (Figure 51).

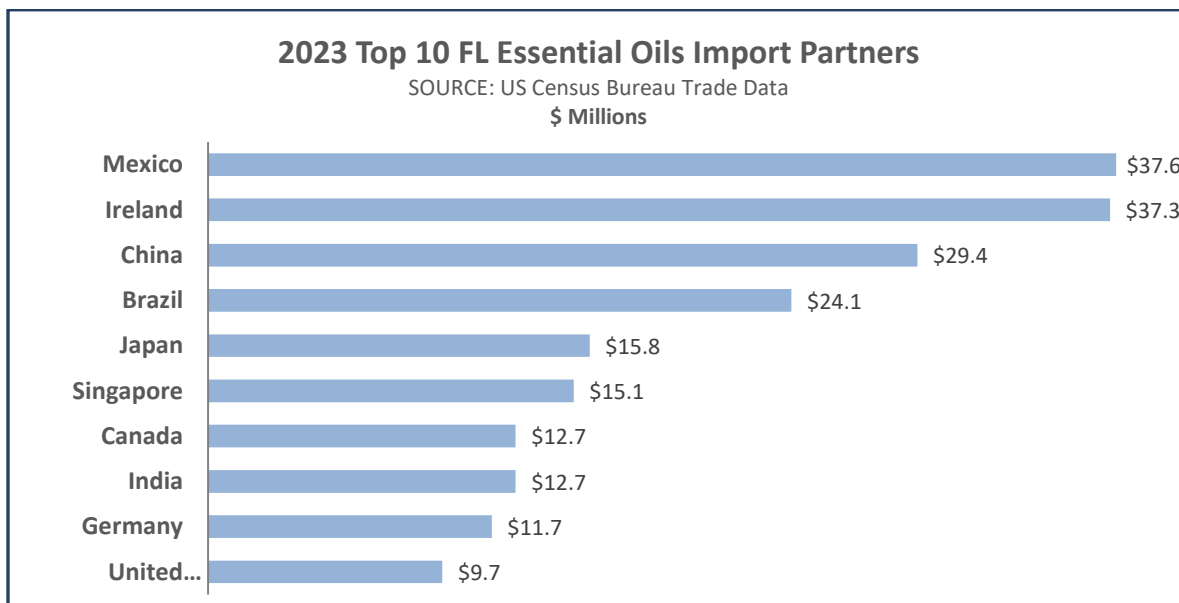


Figure 52 – 2023 Top 10 FL Essential Oils Export Partners

Mexico is Florida’s leading Essential Oils export partner with 12.4% of all Essential Oils exported from Florida (Figure 52). Mexico primarily imports oils of orange, lemon, and citrus from Florida. Mexico’s import of Florida Essential Oils has increased by 24.2% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 1017.7% over 2014.

Nursery Products and Cut Flowers

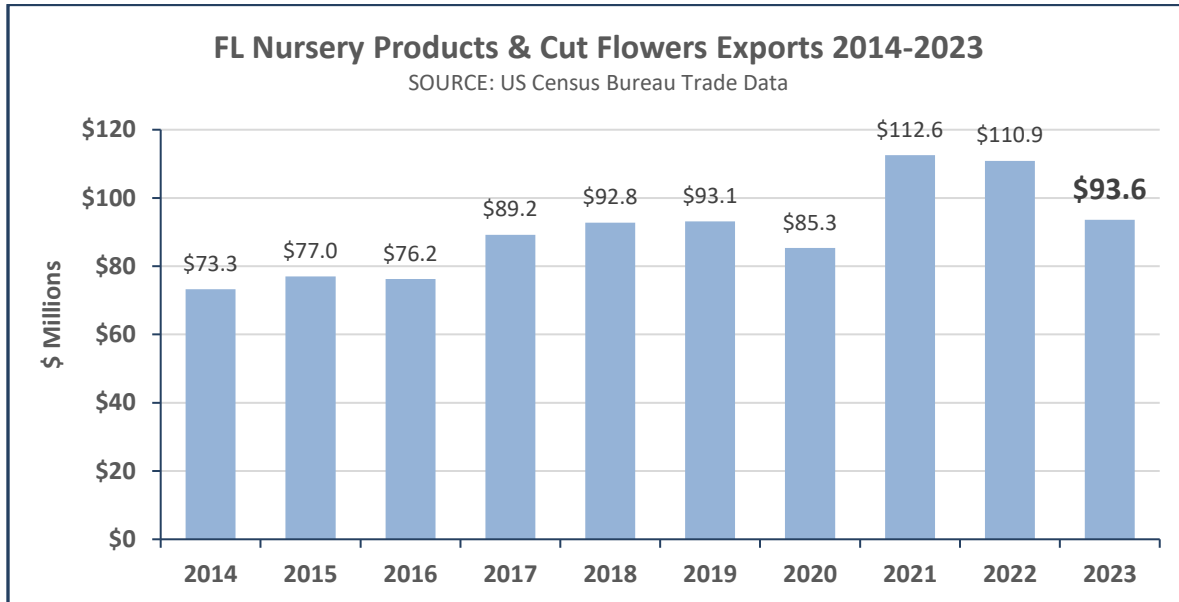


Figure 53 – 2014-2023 FL Nursery Products & Cut Flowers Exports

Florida Nursery Products and Cut Flowers exports have decreased by 15.6% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 27.6% over 2014 (Figure 53).

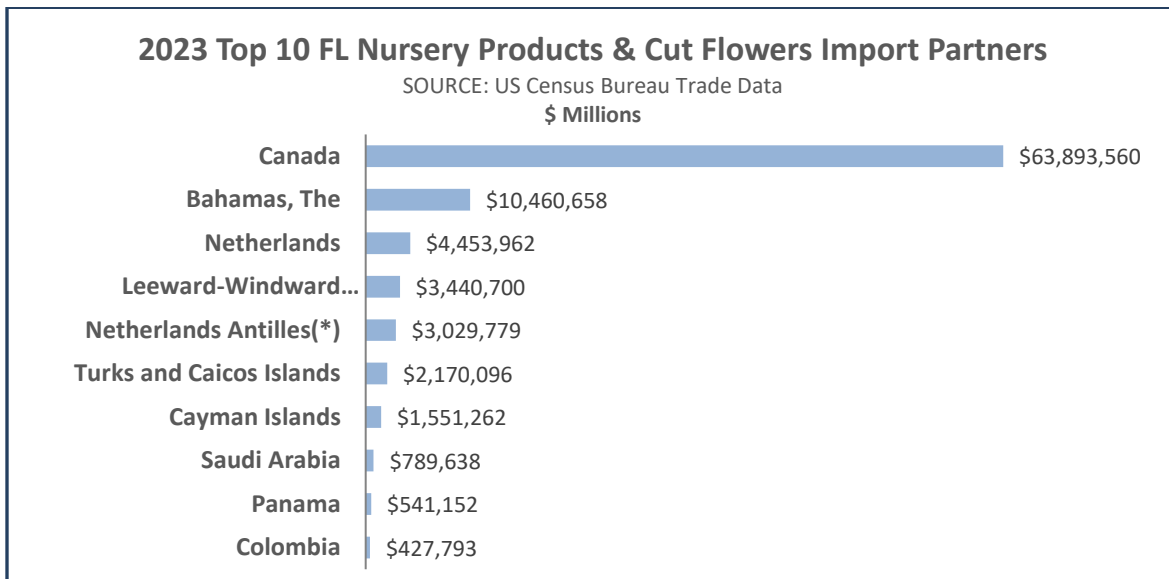


Figure 54 – 2023 Top 10 FL Nursery Products & Cut Flowers Export Partners

Canada is Florida’s leading Nursery Products and Cut Flowers export partner with 68.3% of all Nursery Products and Cut Flowers exported from Florida (Figure 54). Canada primarily imports live plants, cuttings, and bulbs. Canada’s import of Florida Nursery Products and Cut Flowers has decreased by 18.1% in 2023 over 2022 and increased by 40.4% over 2014.

Orange Juice

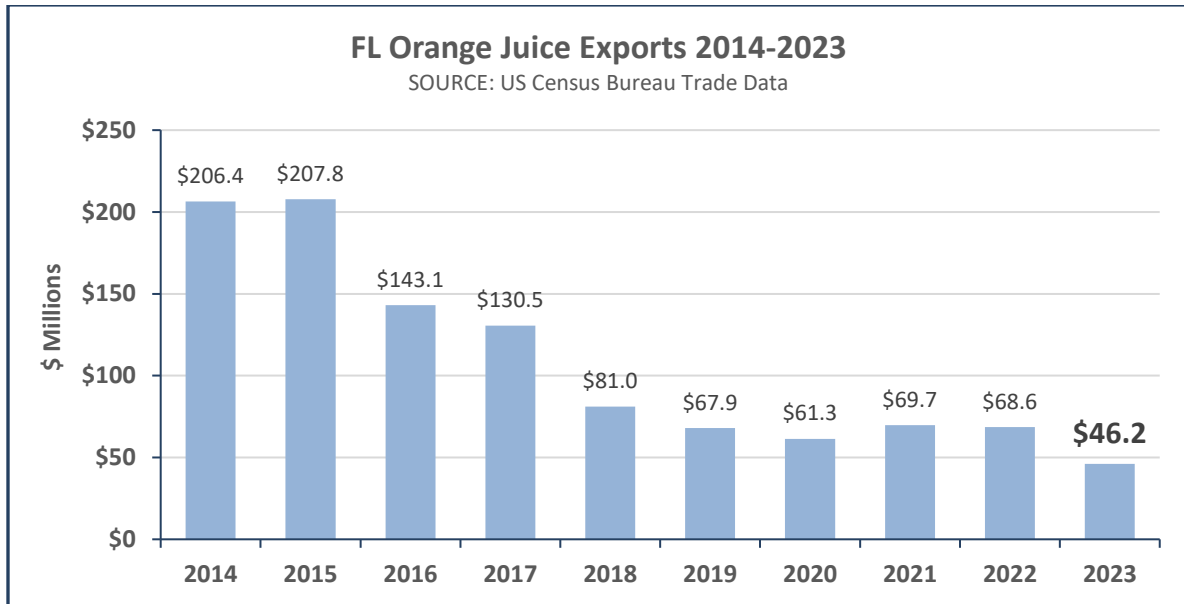


Figure 55 – 2014-2023 FL Orange Juice Exports

Florida Orange Juice exports have decreased by 32.7% in 2023 over 2022 and decreased by 77.6% over 2014 (Figure 55).

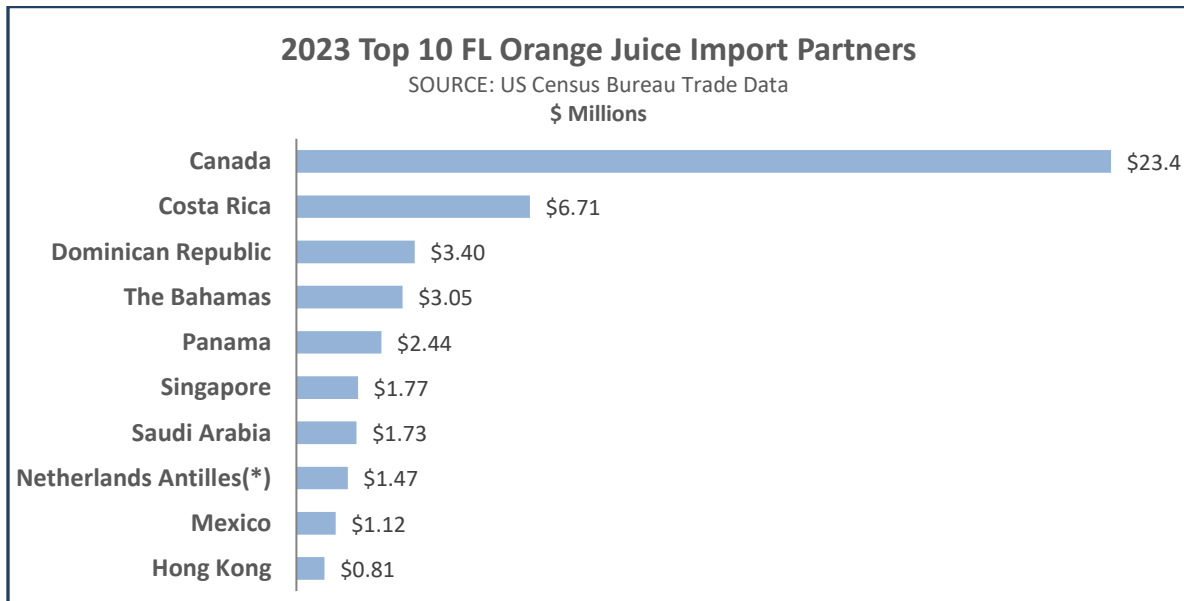


Figure 56 – 2023 Top 10 FL Orange Juice Export Partners
